The date is set both by the Solar and Lunar calendars. It falls around the darkest time of the Solar year, the Winter Solstice, as well as the dark of the Lunar month. That's why Hanuka moves around every year.

The holiday of Channakkah celebrates the return of the Light. The Menorah, or special candelabra, adds one more candle for each of the nights and the Light increases for eight days.

Latkes, (potato pancakes fried in oil) and dreidle, (a spinning top game of luck) is often played.

Bringing Khanuka into the present ... It is a story that reminds me of for the current climate.

The holiday remembers a political and social struggle, a battle of the adamant minority versus a powerful political majority. It celebrates the victory of the 'Small and the Few' versus the 'Big and Mighty'.

The literal translation of Hanukkah is "Re-Dedication. *Now* is the time for us re-dedicate ourselves to what is important, *even crucial*, in the coming years.



as he became Malik El Shabazz.


Brother John was 46...

as did we.


But my point is neither anger or grief...



A Pipe Ceremony will be held Saturday, December 31st, at 11:45.


Those who gathered at the Community Center for this ceremony, led by Mimi Calpestri in early December, shared a beautiful experience together.

Community Expression:

Downtown Park:

- 1. Park improvements- Trash cans. Chas will check Uline for matching of the ones here.
- 2. Irrigation system updates-Rob Pool is coming out to check out the pump in DT park 11-15-16 at 10am.
- 3. Zoe and Mark Butler met with an Arborist to look at the redwood, we need to have a drip line around the roots for deep soak once a week, as well as cutting away the grass around the base to clear the roots. Need mulch around base as well as a metal boarder.

Mesa Park:

- 1. Well pump replacement estimates, backflow pump broken, pump is pulling in plastic from the impeller. The representative from Norcal Pump works who looked at the motor estimated that we need a smaller motor (6k). Feels the casing is failing as well. Need new pump and casing. The toilets should be switched to BPUD water until the well is fixed. Charles, we should have a warranty for the pump from Weeks. Cost estimate for just replacing the pump is \$5600-\$6000. Charles will contact Weeks about guarantees, Mark will call Norcal for another quote on if we need to replace the casing and what the guarantees/warrantee
- 2. Park improvements. Need to order woodchips.
- Graffiti removal. Chas is looking for paint to cover the pieces.




