But that was then and this is now. This year I'm excited about a brand new product for the Winter Faire. I call it a talismanic wall hanging.

The design came together through a wonderful series of synchronous events. I didn't have a clear idea of what I was going to make until a picture that I had cut out of a magazine caught my eye.

It was a drawing of a human head in profile. I saw that I could letter 'BOLINAS' in the brain and call it "Bolinas — state of mind."

I liked the symbolism of the Bolinas state of mind but the talismanic wall hanging needed something else. I wasn't sure what it was. And it began to bug me.

"Relax." I told myself. "The answer will come to you."

"Relax?!" I flashed on the word. "That's it! That's the missing component for the talismanic wall hanging a positive directive, relax."

It was the perfect addition to the talismanic wall hanging, and I titled the series "RELAX BOLINAS"

I pumped out a bunch of talismanic wall hangings and soon I was surrounded with RELAX. Immediately the "RELAX BOLINAS" talismanic wall hanging began to work it's magic on me. I began to relax about making product for the Winter Faire. And I especially began to relax about the "RELAX BOLINAS" talismanic wall hanging.

"It's perfect the way it is." I thought to myself as I studied the primitive product. "There's no messy frame to get in the way and a single tack mounts it on the wall."

In my mind's eye I pictured the talismanic wall hanging on someone's wall and their guests looking at it and thinking to themselves "Oh, that's the proper spirit here. I'm in Bolinas - I should RELAX."

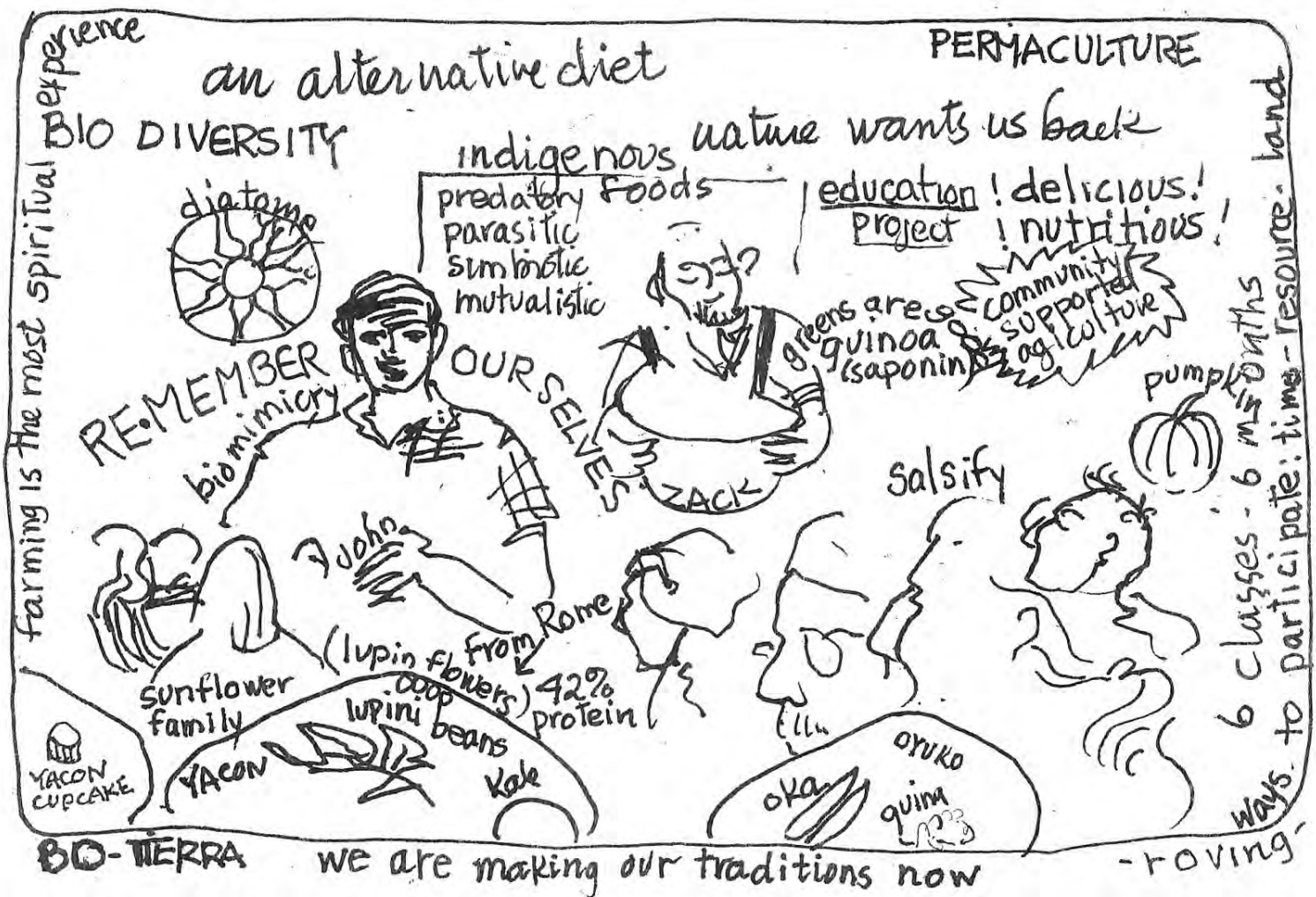

Ecologist David Ainley will present and discuss a special screening of his documentary *The Last Ocean*. The Ross Sea, Antarctica is the most pristine stretch of ocean on Earth, a vast, frozen landscape teeming with whales, seals and penguins carving out a place on the very edge of existence. For more than 30 years Ainley has traveled there to study this unique ecosystem, but international fishing fleets recently found their way to the Ross Sea, targeting Antarctic Toothfish (marketed as Chilean Sea Bass) and threatening the delicate balance of nature. This beautifully filmed documentary follows the race to protect the Ross Sea from our insatiable appetite for fish. Camera/Director: **Peter Young**. (New Zealand 2012) 88 min. plus discussion.

Presenter and film subject Dr. David Ainley has made 30 trips to Antarctica and the Southern Ocean. He is involved in research on penguin demography, and for the past 10 years has been engaged in trying to protect the Ross Sea from industrial fishing (lastocean.org). He's written four books and several publications about the ecology of marine top predators: seabirds, mammals and sharks.

This presentation is part of Science on Screen, a series pairing film screenings with lively scientific discussions. The series is made possible by a grant from the Coolidge Corner Theatre and the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation.

BoTierra

The Bo Tierra benefit was a beautiful expression of sustainability and community.

Perhaps you know the history of BoTierra, how John Glavis and Penny VanDyk teamed up to create a permaculture site on the big mesa.

Except that BoTierra is more than a permaculture site. It's also a laboratory for the investigation of underutilized or forgotten foods of indigenous peoples.

The benefit was a food fest of those forgotten foods. Yacon, Oca and Quinoa are now familiar fare in Bolinas thanks to BoTierra.

But I'd never heard of the lupina bean of the lupine plant which was served at the benefit.

John gave a talk in front of a slideshow. He explained one slide that particularly caught my attention. There was a circle in the middle with FOOD written on it. Radiating from the center were different strategies for helping: 'land' was one, and 'energy' was another, and "land & energy" was another. The idea was to find a place where one could contribute to the growth of healthy, local food.

That graphic made clear to me that food is central to life. What's at the hub of the Wheel of Life? Food. And what can we all believe in - food.

We can bring back the sacred in our daily lives by honoring our food.

Thank you BoTierra for helping me be a far-out foody.

BOOK REVIEW

... Book Three, "Into the Mystic," which is set mostly in India, might be accurately termed a masterpiece of spiritual literature. It's also a brilliant tale of adventure for adults seeking enlightenment. Jack Kerouac would surely enjoy it. So would Harry Potter's J. K. Rowling.

The narrator (and main character) describes the beauty he finds in poverty and the poetry found in prison. He portrays drug dealers and the divine, crossing borders and frontiers both real and imaginary. At times reading the book feels like traveling on a slowly moving train that makes local stops across a phantasmagoric landscape. Pilgrims climb aboard, travel briefly and disembark. Soldiers check passports. Brady goes to the end of the line, where he becomes deadly ill. A sense of suspense surrounds him and philosophical questions rise up from the dust and the camel dung.

"Why had I been touched by this madness of the wandering mendicant?" he asks. "In my heart of hearts I know that it's precisely this madness that is permitting me to view these cross-sections of the world's humanity." He adds, "I'm not a part of it, but I'm seeing it as closely as I can, and meeting it on its own terms."

Along the way, Brady records nearly everything he sees, hears, smells and touches: "the rumbling, honking cars and buses outside the open window, the scratchy radio, fumes from the traffic, the incense burning on the small shrine."
