The Gingerbread House

The gingerbread house making event was put on by the BCLT (Bolinas Community Land Trust) after their Annual membership meeting.

The BCLT sponsoring a house-making event seemed totally appropriate.

A pre-fab house making kit was provided to each investor. Kathleen and I collaborated on a house.

Four slabs of gingerbread made up the walls and two slabs were roof pieces. Candy sprinkles and such were laid out on a table and each builder was given a small tub of vanilla frosting to glue the gingerbread slabs together.

On the table with the candy sprinkles was a tangled pile of hair-like red licorice strands. Perplexed by the color, the red licorice seemed more appropriate for a Halloween scene with entrails and the like.

After receiving our kit and selecting some decorations we got right to work buttering up the pie plate base with frosting in preparation for setting the walls.

While working with the gingerbread house-making kit I simultaneously imagined a similar full-scale build: *The slab walls instead of being made of gingerbread are made of lightweight aggregate material like concrete, but warmer and prettier and easier to work with. After preparing a foundation two people can build a gingerbread house in a matter of hours.*

That was the grand fantasy that transpired while building the miniature gingerbread house.

Unfortunately the vanilla frosting did not have the proper adhesive qualities and the slab roof would slide right off the slab walls.

Mark Butler intervened early in the game and suggested that some people were tying their houses together with the strands of red licorice.

What? That red licorice again? At first I rebelled but moments later found myself lassoing the roof with red licorice. Felt a bit like putting a blue tarp over a leaky roof, but the red licorice, as gummy as it was, held the house together, and we wound up with a decent looking gingerbread house.

The full-size fantasy house was likewise bound with bright red ropes. Yes, perfect for Burning Man or the Backyard Mesa.
