



Stephen was a manager and new book buyer at Green Apple Books in San Francisco for nearly ten years. In 2014, he opened and ran Green Apple Books on the Park, the newest branch of the 50-year-old institution. Stephen is a member of the steering committee for the Bay Area Book Festival, and serves on the boards of Dorothy, a publishing project, Open Letter Books, and the Center for the Art of Translation. He has served as a juror for various literary prices prizes, including the Best Translated Book Award, the ABA's Indies Choice Award, and two NEA juries. His writing has appeared in the Paris Review Daily, Music & Literature magazine, Tin House, BOMB, and The Scofield. He is the editor of a series for Literary Hub about bookselling in the 21st century, and is currently writing a book about fog.

Molly worked at Green Apple Books from 2009 to 2012. When she's not at the bookstore on Saturdays or bookselling behind-the-scenes at home, Molly is the Programs and Communications Manager at 826 Valencia, a nonprofit organization in San Francisco dedicated to supporting under-resourced students with their writing skills. Since 2012 Molly has worked both in programs and in communications for the organization. She has been the editor of the 826 Quarterly and 642 Big Things to Write About: Young Writer's Edition, among other titles published by 826 Books. Molly has also served as a juror for the Scholastic Art and Writing Awards for young writers, and has led workshops for educators and creative professionals on how to use creative writing to empower youth and build community.





Tuning in Joanne Kyger's Radio Electronico

The exhibition at Gospel Flat Farmstand Gallery in December is a laboratory called Tuning in Joanne Kyger's Radio Electronico. Partially inspired by the venerable writer and long time Bolinas resident who passed away in 2017. Speaking

about defining poetry she says:

"Space starts to get really compacted. Also I've moved a lot from linear space....that linear space was not a space that I really thought or experienced in. Although it is a good space for your head to follow at times-drop a little linear space in to reassure people! [Laughter.] But that space is really, like, chunks of things, and a word reverberates...that's why one word can be a poem. As long as it'll reverberate and keep doing that vibration of meaning, then it works. I really like phrases now that have some internal turning, that seem to turn around all the time inside. So it even gets out of meaning after awhile, it gets into being a mantra or it hangs in a different way in the air."

Keith Evans will display the space of the gallery as a set for a curiosity cabinet of furniture, life lists, radio video, sound, 3D photos and text for the visitors to observe and perform their own curiosity within. A 17th century conversation in the era of e-waste. Primarily a live cinema performance artist, his work uses language, graphics, book arts, radio,

installation, kinetic sculpture, dance, film, video and sound, with an expanded idea of performativity.

Keith writes, "This autumn I heard some voices, noisy murder of crows in the eucalyptus tips, murmurs and scratching throats. Music and recitation that invokes the ghostly ambience of past dinner party conversations that filled the house I live in, when the former occupant, Bob Grenier would pull the volumes down. Where is the best place to tune it in? We might ask after the Spirit of place or where to put away the plastic detritus picked out of Pine Gulch Creek, KWMR is on two channels but I still cannot get it in my car. How will these vegetables be cooked? and looking forward to their taste! Where is my phone? Cannot wait to get back!".

Many visitors have their mind blown at the Gospel Flat Farmstand by the exchange of produce, music, currency, seafood, art, earth and nutrition...We know this wider place has storied relationships to visitors of all persuasions and preoccupations...Recreational hiking, surfing, Naturalist observations, Strategic Coastal defense, Radio histories and innumerable destination moments of Art and Poetry. Being together, where the mountain transmits a quixotic dharma talk; we receive the audience as a way of looking at looking at Bolinas.


