## Our Church

Our Church needs a new foundation.

I'm an Episcopagan not a Presbyterian but I love Calvary Presbyterian. I also love Reverend Bob, and I want to support the Church.

So I'm coming out of retirement to sing a benefit concert this Sunday, February 15 at 1pm (after the regular Sunday service) at Calvary Presbyterian Church.

This concert is the first in a series of benefit concerts to raise money for a new foundation for the church. It's a good cause and I urge you to attend and give to a worthy cause..

Actually I never retired from being a singer/songwriter because I never got hired. Art became my occupation and I kept songwriting pure as my avocation.

When Amy first brought me to Bolinas we stayed in the city with Barbara and Barry, Amy's friends from the old Bolinas days. I knew that Barry was a semi-famous rock star but I noticed he never picked up his guitar. I asked him why.

"I turned my favorite hobby into my profession and I ruined it for myself." Barry told me. "Now I only play if they pay me."

How sad, I thought, that will never happen to me. I already had plenty of experience in commercial art and I could see how making business out of art could smother one's creative fire.

So I wrote songs for fun. But I still wrote them, songs about where I lived, which happened most often to be Bolinas.

One of my first Bolinas songs is "Bobo Man." It's a celebration of the drop-out spirit of Bolinas.

*I feel just like a Bobo Man*

*I'm doing the best I can*

*But I feel just like a Bobo Man*

*I am what I am.*

*I'm a hard core unemployed*

*but I don't get annoyed*

*after all, life was meant to be enjoyed*

*Enjoy it while you can*

*before the shit hits the fan*

*and shortens your life span.*

I don't sing "Bobo Man" anymore. I find it's message to be dated and adolescent. Still I appreciate the rock and roll period of my life that is exemplified by "Bobo Man."

The quintessential Bolinas song for me is "Bolinas, Bolinas." The song was given to me by Adan from Patzcuaro. He and Myra spent a year in Bolinas. Before they left he told me,

"StuArt, I have a song for you, but I only have two words."

Two words can make a song. "I told him "What are they?"

"Bolinas, Bolinas." he answered.

"that's not two words, Adan." I laughed. "That's the same word twice!"

That's why Bolinas is repeated in the song. It's so nice, it's said twice - like New York, New York.

"Bolinas, Bolinas" is so syrupy and sweet that I've taken to following it immediately with "Border Patrol"

Now "Border Patrol" like "Bobo Man" comes from that era when the outlaw ethic still prevailed in Bolinas.

*My town has a bad reputation*

*for fending off a tourist invasion.*

*There's a sign pointing which way to go*

*pretty soon that sign will there no more*

*That sign has got to*

*says the Border Patrol.!*

It's fun to stir up the xenophobia with some good ol' Raucous & Rollus.

Carol Friedman from Point Reyes gave a workshop for the Board of the Community Center on Board duties and responsibilities. First off she asked the members of

the Board if they knew the mission statement of the Community Center. No one did. Carol recommended everyone memorize it.

I had just seen a photograph in the Citizen of Carol leading a flash mob line dance at the Point Reyes Farmer's Market. On the spur of the moment, just for fun, I raised my hand.

"Carol, I'll turn the mission statement into a song if you'll lead us in dancing to it."

"Deal!" Carol answered.

After the workshop was over I got to work setting the mission statement to song. I wrote and rewrote the language of the Community Center mission statement in my best calligraphy.

After a number of iterations I began to hear the prosody, the rhythm of the words. I listened more carefully and heard the suggestion of a melody. I grabbed my guitar and bang! I bagged it.

Six months later when Carol came back to give us a workshop on fundraising, I sang the song to her and she led us in dance.

Now we sing the mission statement song at the beginning of every meeting of the Community Center Board.

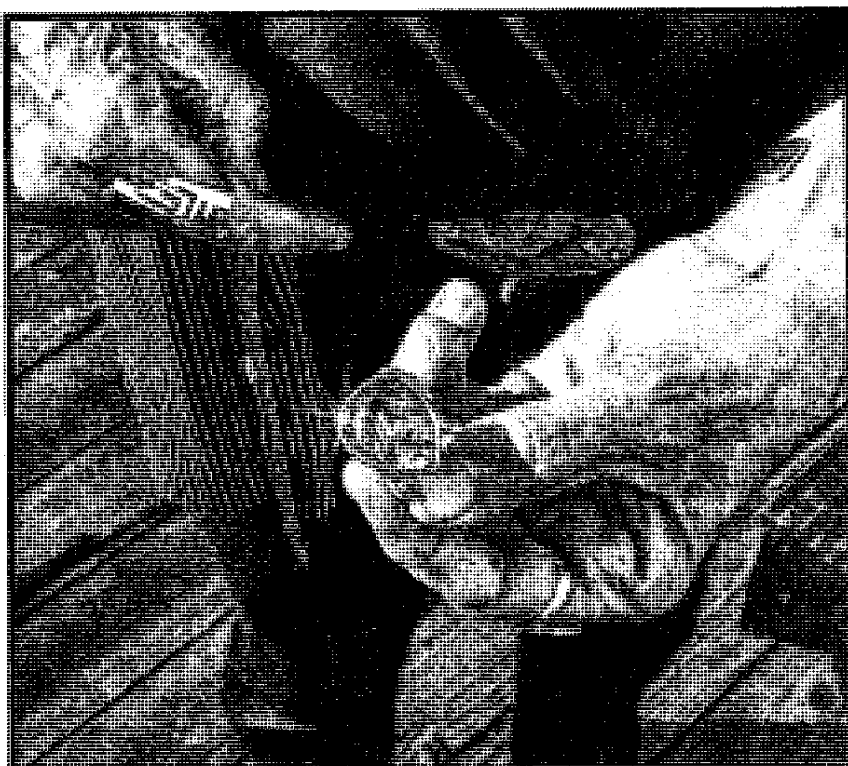

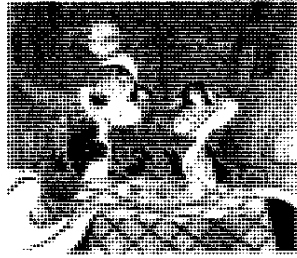


A ring made by Alan Giovannetti of Bolinas set with Venus Hair Stone, a form of rutiled quartz.

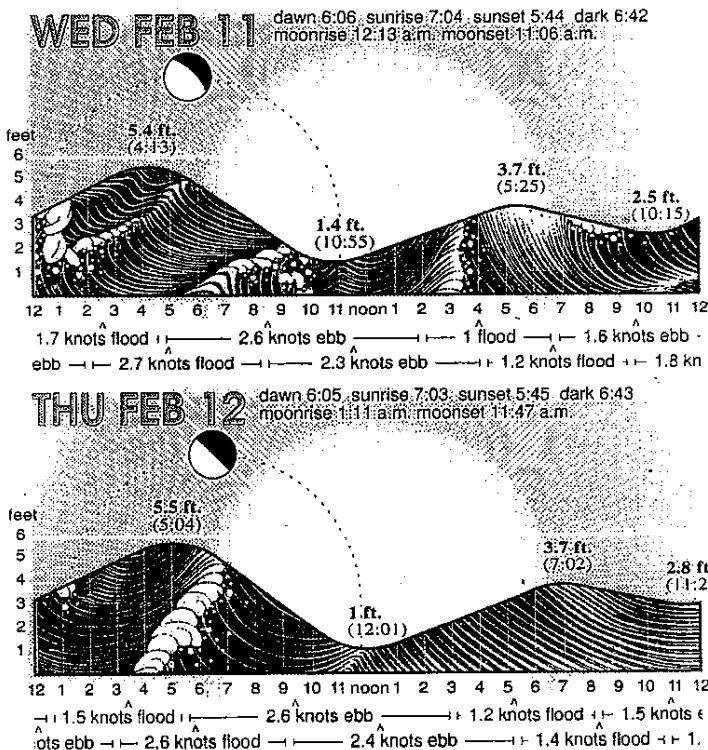

**Community Expression:**

Karen :Feb 14<sup>th</sup> 11am-12pm memorial for John Nassarah. Where is the placement of bench going to be? Plaque placement does not fit on bench. Charles: placement of bench is going to be in the triangle between the two paths facing the store behind the pizza oven. For the plaque, perhaps a low stone with plaque facing up would work. Karen: concerned grass will grow over it and prefer a stone large enough for people to be able to read. Charles: The grass will be maintained so it will not be overgrown around the plaque. Vic: there is a granite piece on Yucca that could be used that the BPUD wants to get rid of. Karen: Rick Springer is willing to do the installation and there is a bit of money to pay for rock material. Date, time, and placement: Dylan motions to approve, Charles seconds.

**Downtown Park:**

- 1) Fixing Men's restroom urinal – Charles: could we change it to a dry urinal? Dylan: Yes, the new urinal is a dry one in MP. Vic: Ask Leah what they paid at CC. For now there is a bag over the broken urinal. Dylan: Would be better to get the bathrooms off well water.  
a) Both bathrooms downtown need to be steam cleaned.

- 2) Bolinas Middle School Renaissance fair Sat. May 30<sup>th</sup> request contact Belle Wood (Victoria motion Dylan second 4-0 aye) approved

**Maintenance Report:**

- 1) baseball field maintenance and little league report MP Angie: There are 3 teams this year.  
a) Field was mowed this week for the first time. Water at the well was shut off for a while but is now back on. Jennifer has asked for a meeting to find out how the electric bill will be split between MP and BPUD.
- 2) Ordering new swing chains for MP- talking to Karen on 01-27-15 at Bolinas Bay Hardware. Victoria: need to order 4 chains to replace both rusted swings. Baby swings should be turned around to face the park. The swing kit we have should include a wrench that is able to turn the seats around.
- 3) Installing new park ordinance signs MP: Charles: two signs in pump house.  
a) The glass sign that is lying in the grass could be moved and used near the ballpark. Bryan: any left over funds from the project need to be spent: could go towards a snack shack.
- 4) Delivery of infield mix to baseball field. Charles we have always had only one load, it would be better to have two transfer loads (4 truck loads) where the infield is higher, that way there will be less water damage. League is willing to pay for transfer load. Angie: 1<sup>st</sup> week of Feb date planned for delivery. Kids are supposed to start practice the 2<sup>nd</sup> week of Feb games don't start till March. Concern is making ruts between the soccer and baseball field. Issue: How much volume and how it should be delivered onto the field will be decided upon delivery of the first mix load.
- 5) Fixing the Tractor. Suki, when taking the tractor up for it's last service, was told by the mechanic that getting a new mower might be a less expensive option as the old one is reaching a point of being as expensive as a new one. Charles: We do need a new push mower for winter but the old ride on mower doesn't need to be replaced. Bryan: we could hire an outside contractor for the mowing.
- 6) Charles: need a maintenance worker for both parks for cleaning (bathrooms, garbage, small repairs, dog clean up, picking up trash) and

mowing. Charles: talk to Ro'von to get a bid for mowing DT and MP.

- 7) Charles: get a spread of Molemax (55 lb drum) for the perimeter of the fields to help prevent goffers. Angie: the league might be willing to help pay for that.
- 8) Art Car in the parking lot. Charles: needs to call the police to move it.
- 9) Boat trailer in MP parking lot needs to be moved as well.
- 10) Picnic tables for MP. Dylan: will continue to look into it. Budget around \$2400

**Irrigation Report:**

- 1) Soccer and baseball field project. Bryan: Work is done; we just need to turn the water on and finishing the punch list items before the inspection as well as getting the last payments to cover costs.  
a) Victoria: Could we install a diaper-changing table in the MP bathroom? Bryan will price them.

**Treasurer's Report:**

- 1) CDBG Grant- community development block grant for \$13,000
- 2) FHCPA Reports from Christine Cunha. Measure I and A funds are in.

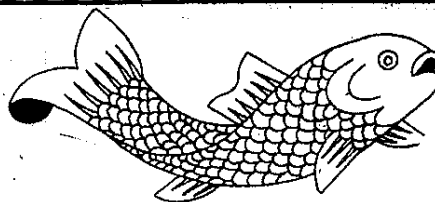
