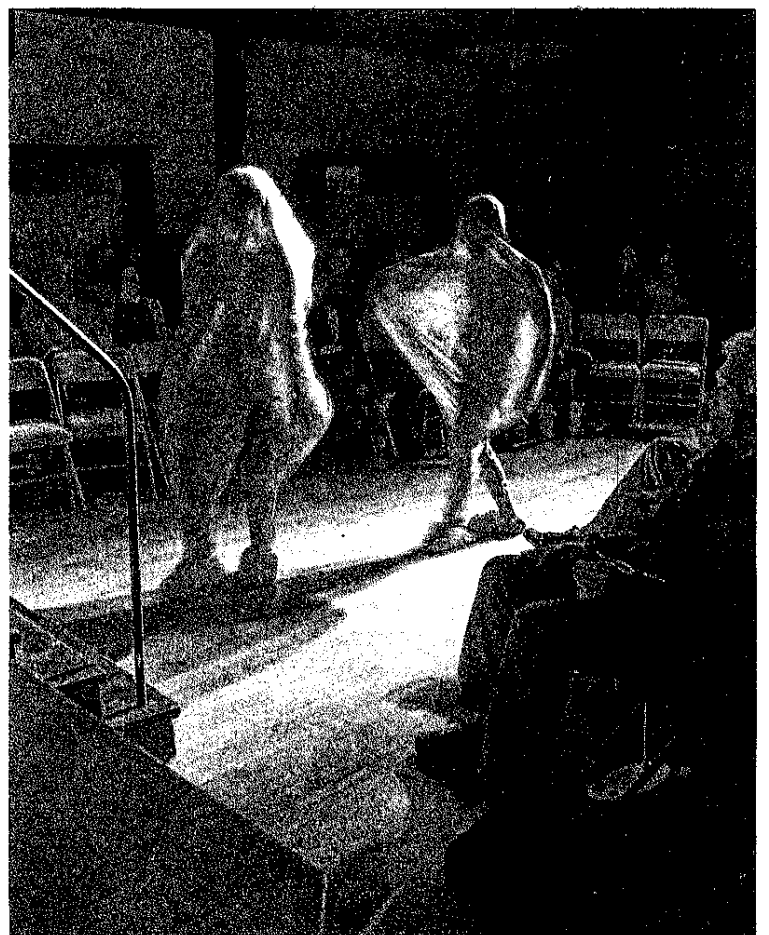

Folly in Love

Wow! The Freebox Follies were a fabulous expression of community, and more down-home and entertaining than the glitzy Oscars.

The theme of this year's Follies was "Folly in Love" and the show began with a performance by Amelia involving a strange jungle cat creature shipped by mistake from ebay. Love prevailed.

Our beloved manager, Lia Sabbatini, now on maternity leave, made a surprise appearance to ask the audience to support the Community Center's drive for new chairs. You can sponsor a new, comfortable chair for thirty dollars, and I will hand paint your name (first name and initial) on the chair as a sponsor.

Our director, Randi Arnold has secured a grant to cover half of the cost of 150 new chairs. The grant money needs to be used by March 1st, so please act quickly and we all can enjoy Community Center events in increased comfort and style.

Zack Fuller was Master of Ceremonies. Zack comes to us from Santa Cruz, RDI and the organic farming scene and he's a great addition to the community.

I recounted being washed ashore on Duxbury Reef and clothing myself in plaid from the Freebox. I sang the Freebox Anthem which I wrote in 1983 with Bob Dill, the originator of the Freebox.

Then I accompanied Martine as she sang her wonderful song about the Freebox:

*"The Freebox is a magical place,
it's a state of mind and a state of grace."*

A bevy of beautiful models sashayed down the runway and then Jerry Bo Jeste appeared as the Phantom of the Freebox looking for his missing sock, which turned out to be on Amber's foot.

Cadance made her stage debut singing a lovely folk song and accompanying herself on guitar.

Susan Tachera next led the little kids in "You Gotta Sing When Your Spirit Says Sing." Susan had a bag of colored scarves which she distributed to the kids. Then in rapid succession she had them sing, wave, jump, spin and dance. It was a totally charming display of youthful enthusiasm and exuberance.

Xanthe and Miksu were adorable singing a couple of rocking love songs.

Michael Pinkham in a red velvet cape performed a rendition of Little Red Riding Wolf with his two daughters, Rain Noel and Beija Flor.

More models walked the walk and then it was time for intermission.

The new owners of Smiley's, Leila and Ashley graciously ran the bar. There was a Bo-tique set up in the back of the Community Center where Freebox Fashions were for sale.

(Note: all the money raised at the Follies goes to

support the Community Center and the Freebox.)

The Follies resumed after with a screening of my new video "Documenting the Freebox" (which will be shown again on Tuesday, March 3 at 6:30pm)

Fashions created from Freebox finds by Amelia were then modeled, such as "Hay Okie Salsa" (made from Bolinas soccer referee's tights and a patchwork skirt) and a "Bolinas Drinking Jacket" (made of two scarves and a wool jacket, which came with a bottle of Frey organic wine and a wine glass.)

Fiona wore a beautiful blue creation of Amelia's called "Fiona's Dream."

Jan Broek sang his original song "Falling in Love" which he revised for the Follies to "Folly in Love." Zack and I amplified Jan's vocal and guitar with our wireless mics in a delightful *ménage à trois*.

Cadance followed with a sweet ukelele song.

More models followed: Sagola, Salena, Bronwen, Taji and Maya (among others) were absolutely stunning. Serita was joyfully welcomed back from the hospital.

Ashley and Lyla paraded in matching pinstripe overalls, just like in the poster. Ashley and her friend also appeared in voluminous tie-dyed coveralls. (and when I saw coveralls I mean totally enshrouded in diaphanous fabric like post-punk burkhas)

My esteemed colleague, Steve Heilig, modelled my line of menswear called "Piss Elegant." Charlie Callahan and Sensitive Sean made cameo appearances during that segment. Both went topless,

Finally Beth Carusillo brought down the house singing a rendition of "Wig in a Box" from "Hedwig and the Angry Inch." All the models danced on stage for the grand finale. It was a totally glamorous glam-rock finish.

As I said at the beginning, "Folly in Love" was a fabulous expression of community and local culture. 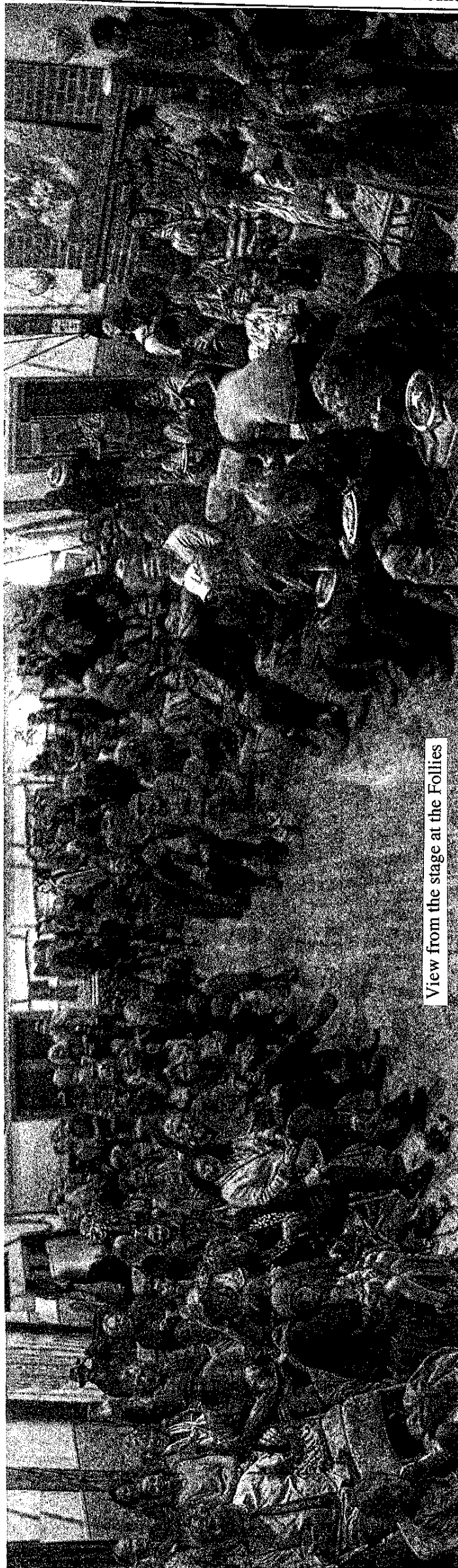

Resignation from Recently Formed Cannabis Tincture Distribution Group:

I recently heard rumors circulating in Bolinas re: my involvement in a Group being formed to establish a local distribution system for The Founder's medicinal cannabis tinctures. He invited me to be the Group's Scribe and attend a meeting in Bo Bo, which I did. Though I've used and praised his products for several years and considered committing myself completely, these unfounded rumors reminded me of what "goes with the territory" ... and how my involvement could distract from what I consider his worthy ambition. Rather than become an excuse for counter-productive agendas, I am withdrawing my involvement so the Group has a chance to be judged fairly on its merits.

To honor my commitment to The Group, before submitting my public resignation, I e-mailed The Founder, "I'm trying to think of a reason to dissemble the above version of my public resignation rather than end it as below, a restrained version of my true experience, but can't; any ideas?"

He replied, "No need to do any of this."

Really? Reckon that "goes with the territory", too; others thinking they can unconscionably use then dismiss me to avoid accountability. Therefore:

... Considering how The Founder shined on his promises and agreements following the meeting, both to the Group in general and me personally, instead choosing to blame me publicly by condemning me for these rumors' allegations preemptively, he convinced me to resign before The Group's major challenges inevitably arise. Though I retain faith in his products, and wish the Group success, I have lost trust in The Founder's ability to honorably deal with either The Group's challenges or me personally.

I wish to publically thank whoever started these rumors for expediting the inevitable before I became inextricably entangled in the project. If they initiate, I'm willing to thank them personally.
