

On Saturday I attended the opening for Ron Garrigues's show in San Francisco. Titled "From Beginning to End" it showcased Ron's art from the last 25 years including bronze castings, scratchboard drawings and sumi ink paintings.

The exhibit was at the Varnish Gallery tucked away on Jesse Street, not far from the Museum of Modern Art. The gallery is a beautiful space that shows "edgy" art. Ron's art is certainly edgy, filled with skulls, lingams & yonis and spermatozoa. One person quipped, "It takes balls to put your sperm on the walls." I was reminded of what Bru told me about the paintings of Francis Bacon, who he knew in London. The spurt of white paint that Bacon included in most of his paintings was truly a "money shot" as they say in the porno movie industry. I leave it to your imagination to decipher the term.

Many of Ron's Bolinas friends and supporters showed up for the opening and the Varnish Gallery was packed and throbbing. The bronze sculptures were displayed on pedestal islands that were arranged by Ron's friend Al Farrow. Al is known worldwide for his metal sculpture. He builds cathedrals, synagogues and mosques out of guns and bullets. The combination of religion and weapons is a startling and powerful artistic statement. One of Al's cathedrals, crafted from handguns and bullets is on display at the De Young museum.

The walls were hung with Ron's scratchboard drawings of the Big Bang (the Beginning) and sumi ink representation of zygote and the subsequent overpopulation of the Earth (the End, or the 6th extinction.) On one wall were six bronze castings of lingam-yonis. Ron lived at a Shiva ashram for three years and that experience informs much of his work. He reversed the traditional depiction of the lingam rising from the yoni, and instead placed the butterfly form of the youi as if it was blossoming from the side of the mighty phallic lingam.

Ron's show was a ballsy display of the elemental forces of creation and destruction. His art is especially meaningful during these "end times." I was impressed that the two women, Jen and Kerri, who run the gallery, would mount such a tantric, apocalyptic exhibit. The Varnish Gallery reflects their attention to detail and aesthetic concerntruly, remarkable.

I assisted Ron in preparing the show - cleaning and waxing the bronzes and packing the paintings for transport to the city. I enjoyed helping Ron and connecting with the art scene in the city. Everyone involved in the show seemed like characters from central casting, and the Bolinas crowd at the opening was as colorful and wild as Bolinas itself.

Charlie Docherty told me the next day how impressed he was with the show. "Ron's still doing it at 81." Charlie said. "He's an inspiration to us all."


I am very excited about doing this ---I will be there at the gallery painting during the open hours of the exhibit--so I can share my process with all of you!


