## Fabulous Freebox Follies

Wow, what a fabulous follies! The best one yet - a wonderful rendition of a Bolinas tradition. "We're new in town." Quipped Em-J and Alexia as they introduced themselves as Masters of Ceremony, and indeed the follies was a perfect way to introduce themselves to the town.

After a screening of Marc's lively video of the 2015 Follies, Em-J and Alexi showed their own homemade video of themselves as characters spoofing current perceptions of Bolinas (Much like "Portlandia") From clueless surfers to ardent permaculturalists to wealthy weekenders they provided a hilarious satire of what Bolinas has come to be, or at least what Bolinas is perceived to have become.

Of course the Follies proved that the heart and soul of Bolinas is alive and well, and still populated with beautiful people (no sarcasm intended)

The women modeling fashions were gorgeous and strutted their stuff down the long runway laid out on the floor of the Community Center. I love feminine style and beauty and I was totally smitten by Chelsea, Lucia, Bronwen, Schehera, Victoria, Amelia, Lil, Rebecca and Lia. And I have to applaud Vickisa for artfully doing her thing.

But it wasn't just glamor and fashion. Victoria sang a rousing rendition of the Four Non-Blondes song "What's Going On" backed up by Bronwen and Doug Lee on guitar.

Amelia gave two powerful performances of ritual theater: the Mermaid Queen and a Lakota Water Song where the women in the audience clicked sticks in time. Both of Amelia's pieces gave a profound depth to the Follies that was both beautiful and healing - much needed in these dark times.

John Cozzi sang a heartfelt rendition of "Love of the Common People" by Waylon Jennings. John was backed up by Beth on voice and ukulele.

After intermission, there was a reading of the 23<sup>rd</sup> Psalm, Freebox Version, which was discovered before the show pinned to the door of the Freebox (the 23<sup>rd</sup> Psalm was channeled by Steve Heilig, who intended no blasphemy) *The Freebox is my Macy's, I need not shop... Surely I shall call this recycling, express gratitude for those who maintain it, and add no TV's, computers, other electronic crapola or any forbidden junk and also replenish the Box with some items of value and help clean out the trash, and I shall dwell in the Box of Life and non-consumerism for ever or until it falls down (whichever comes first).*

Bob Dill, the founder of the Freebox, just happened to be visiting from Covalo, and he was summoned from the audience to join me in singing the Freebox Anthem (see page 6)

Beth gave it her all in a rousing performance leading the Bobo Beauties in song as they waved fronds made from a cast-off Ikea lamp found in the Freebox.

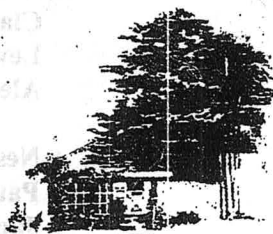
Then DJ Omar got the crowd dancing as they put away chairs in what has become a Freebox tradition.

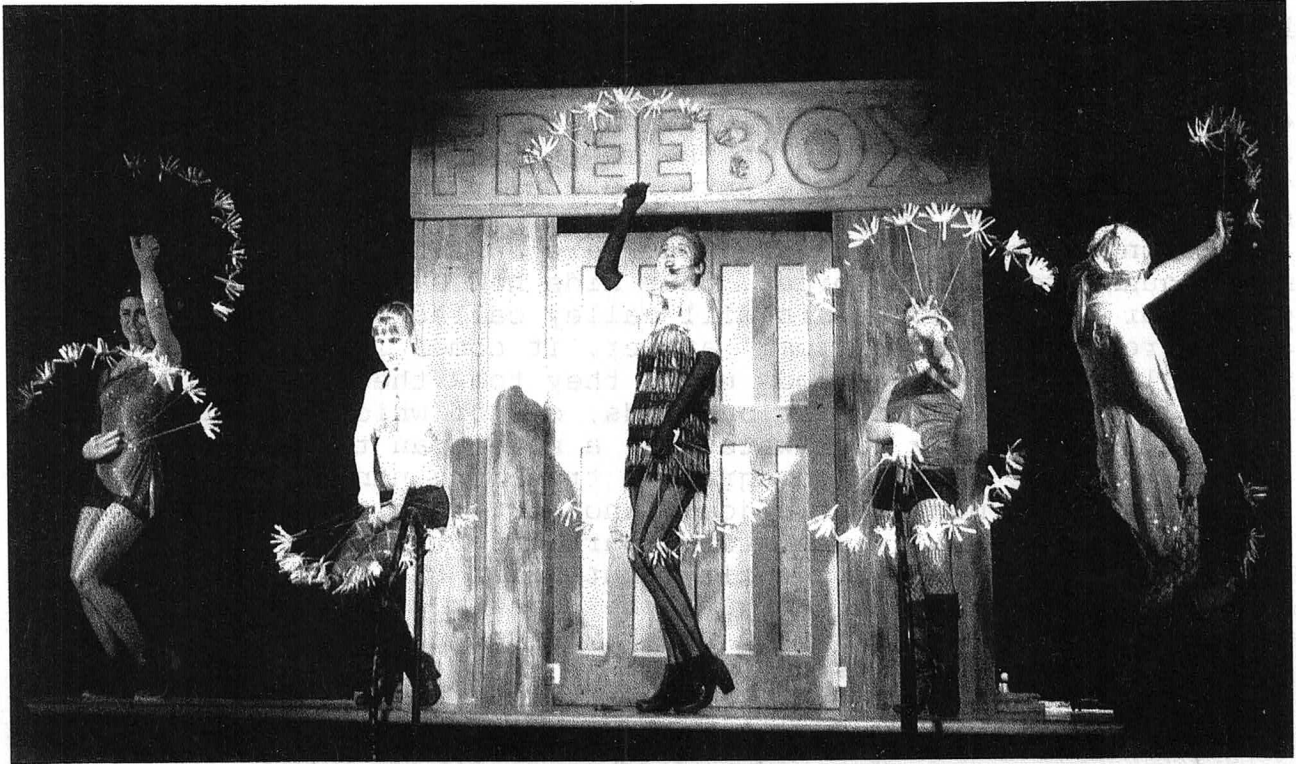

**UN FOOD & AGRICULTURE ORGANIZATION REPORT**

A new report, that has been presented to the UN human rights council on March 8, 2017, is severely critical of the global corporations that manufacture pesticides, accusing them of the "systematic denial of harms", "aggressive, unethical marketing tactics" and heavy lobbying of governments which has "obstructed reforms and paralysed global pesticide restrictions".

The report says pesticides have "catastrophic impacts on the environment, human health and society as a whole", including an estimated 200,000 deaths a year from acute poisoning. Its authors said: "It is time to create a global process to transition toward safer and healthier food and agricultural production."

The global pesticides market is worth \$50bn and companies lobby heavily to resist reforms and regulations.

this discussion led to nostalgia on the subject of water - a big subject at Muir Beach since 1945, when people began to move back after the total evacuation of the few houses at the beach during the war. The was, as represented by a navy lieutenant and his merry men (a dozen young yeomen) had left Muir Beach's water system in condition shambles, with here and there a trickle of dark brown, muddy gunk from broken pipes. Our kids had a standard essay-type piece for their teachers in Mill Valley called water- what is it and where does it come from: answer, it comes in jugs from Over the Hill (or from Muir Woods until they took the handle off the faucet). Good training for our kids, one of which now lives in Australia where they have water but a novel pan toilet arrangement out under a pomegranate tree, the pan picked up once a week by a pan man, what a job! another of which now lives in Izmir in Turkey in a seven-story apartment building right on the beautiful waterfront of the city, but where the water gets turned off many hours daily, along with the power. So Persis (Persis) sent us a poem, her first, in which you can now learn a Turkish word, DUR, which means stop.

but there were no naked tusches.

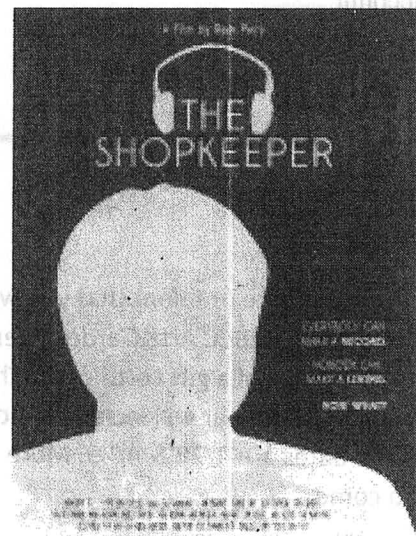
*It's the Freebox, not a debris box.
