





no 'personhood' under our U.S. Constitution



HAPPY INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY!

As part of Women's History Month, I would like to draw your attention again to the ERA ... the Equal Rights Amendment. Why is it still so important that we finally get this passed?

Alice Paul wrote the original ERA in 1923. The current language is still very simple: "Equality of rights under the law shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any state on account of sex."

The ERA flattens the landscape of genderspecific laws, treating all genders as equal in every state. This language includes women and men, plus all other gender definitions and choices. Without the ERA, everyone who is not a heterosexual male is left out of equality once a legal case is appealed to the Federal level.

This is because some state and other local laws have granted equal legal status to all. Some states have not. If our only legal rights remain at the state and local levels, any new laws or policies or **court decisions** from the federal government might trump our local or historical legal protections ... and move us backward by decades or even centuries.

No woman or child is safe in this country as long as any law remains on the books anywhere that allows one gender to "legally" rule another. If some women are suffering somewhere in our country, we are all in danger that we will be next. We technically still have no "personhood" under our U.S. Constitution. We are still legally "chattel" ... which means property. Harming women and children is apparently still not against the law, according to current misinterpretations of our U.S. Constitution. We can change this, by passing the ERA.


Community Center on Sunday, March 12


A DAY WITHOUT A WOMAN

Cell Phones and Health

Breaking: California Public Health Dept. releases its cellphone safety document

After losing a lawsuit to UC Berkeley, the California Dept of Public Health released a document on cell phone safety guidelines it had in its possession since 2010. The document was never released to the public until now.

When Dr. Moskowitz of UC Berkeley's School of Public Health asked to see it in 2014, the CA Dept. of Public Health refused, which prompted Dr. Moskowitz to file a lawsuit alleging violation of the California Public Records Act.

During the trial, the CA Dept. of Public Health argued the document was a draft, and that releasing it would cause panic. See below for more details. (Thank you Dr. Moskowitz for taking action so that everyone can see this important document which should have been released to the public years ago!)

From the document: "regular cell phone use increases the risk of developing some kinds of brain cancer. Some studies have also linked exposure to EMFs from cell phones to fertility problems.

EMFs can pass deeper into a child's brain than an adult's. Also, the brain is still developing through the teen years, which may make children and teens more sensitive to EMF exposures.

For these reasons, parents may want to limit their child's cell phone use to texting, important calls, and emergencies. Cell phone EMFs can affect nearby cells and tissues"

Electromagnetic Radiation Safety, March 2, 2017 (6:00 PM Update)

Prior to the judge's final ruling in Moskowitz v. CDPH, the California Department of Public Health released its cellphone safety document to the *San Francisco Chronicle* this afternoon.

This "fact sheet" summarizes research on cell phone radiation health risks and provides safety tips on how to reduce cell phone radiation exposure. The document highlights a potentially greater risk to "pregnant women, children, and teens." The safety recommendations are similar to those issued by the Connecticut Department of Public Health in May, 2015.
