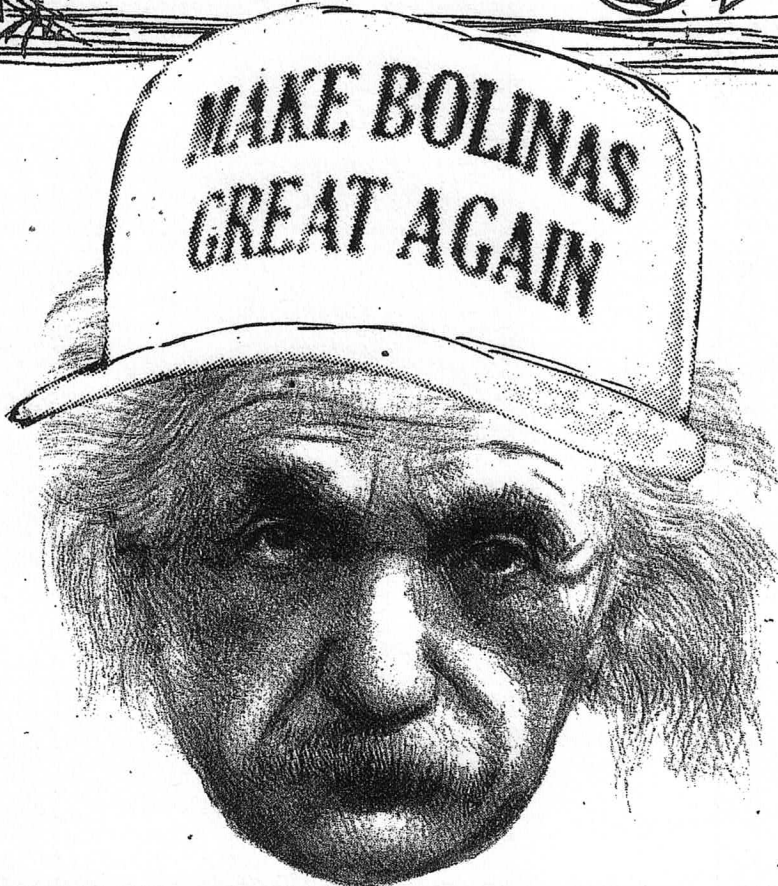

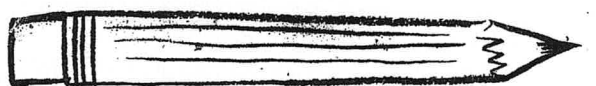

Thank you to Don and crew and now Leila and Ashley for all the good times at Smileys. You guys always have been and are a class act who know how to throw a party.

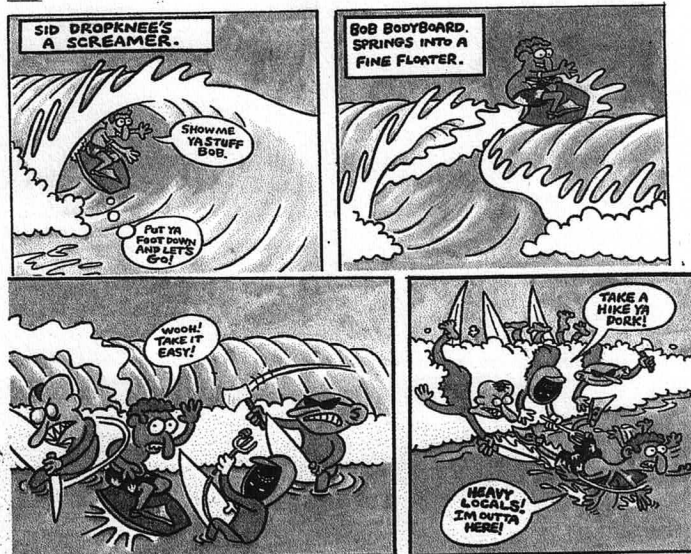

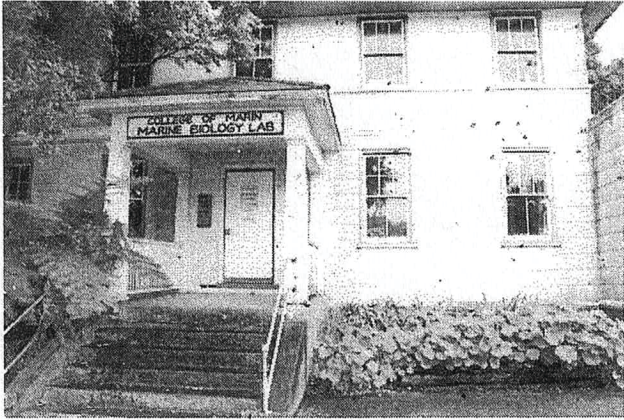

## Marin IJ Editorial:

## Bolinas marine lab deserves public process

College of Marin's long-closed marine laboratory in Bolinas has been a dilemma for years.

For a community college to have its own marine lab was an educational plum. It not only inspired many students, but — because it played host to summer programs for Marin youngsters — turned on a lot of kids to the natural wonders of our coastline.

But a landslide forced the district to close the lab in 2006, and its doors have never reopened to being the center of knowledge and learning it once was. The cost of repairing the landslide and damage to the building were just part of the college's problem. Add to that questions about the wisdom and legal liability of holding classes so close to two active earthquake faults and recent concerns about mold in the building. Further, add declines in COM's enrollment and the potential high sale potential of the property due to its valuable Bolinas water connection. All told, the college board has a lot to consider when deciding whether to repair and reopen the lab. The matter is further complicated by the language in COM's recent capital bond measures that put fixing up the lab among its promised list of projects. Past COM boards have been primed to dispose of the property and the water connection, but they never followed through.

The IJ has been among the community voices that urged COM to try to either turn over the property to Dominican University, Sonoma State or San Francisco State universities — or forge an educational partnership with them. The COM board should make sure those opportunities are fully explored before it decides to auction off the property.

It is heartening that there appears to be growing interest in the Bolinas community in the building, the lab and its dock. That interest should be given a fair chance to coalesce and publicly test any proposal.

A COM spokesperson stressed that the language of the listing of the lab on November's ballot measure was general. No specific commitments were detailed.

The numbers involved in deciding the future of this public property need to be factual. At the very least, the public deserves to see the various challenges detailed in dollars and cents. The property is a unique public asset, if not a valuable educational opportunity.

Because COM prominently made the lab one of the priorities listed in its 2016 bond measure, voters deserve a public process, far more public and inclusive than previous boards' attempts to focus on the building's fate. The COM board may reach a conclusion that might draw criticism, but if approached and conducted properly, its public process should not.

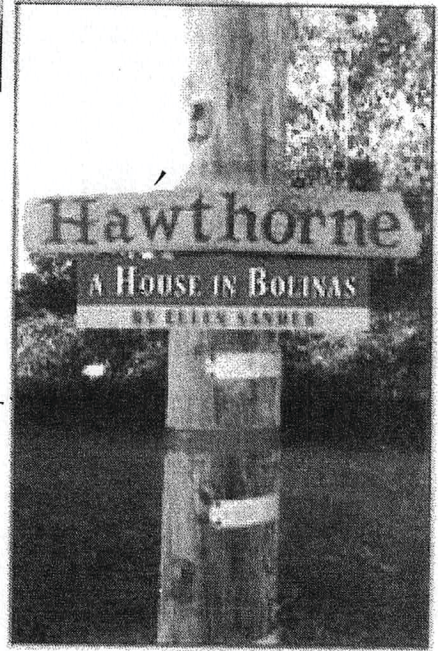
## Sander releases poetry memoir

"Hawthorne, a House in Bolinas," a versified chapbook memoir by city poet Ellen Sander, has just been published by Finishing Line Press. The work, 30 some years in the making, is an unfolding narrative poem occupying a chapbook with snapshots.

"Hawthorne" celebrates a legendary West Marin poetic community of the 1970s, its neighbors and the luminaries who visited. Set in Bolinas, the beach, the eucalyptus and the fog, the poetic portrait captures a legendary epoch in the fabled community.

Among the vignettes are stanzas about locals Robert Creeley, Tom Clark, Aram Saroyan, Bobbie Louise Hawkins, Richard Brautigan, Lewis MacAdams and Joanne Kyger (and more), as well as visitors Allen Ginsberg, Gerard Malanga and Bob Dylan.

Sander, a pioneering New York rock journalist (author of "Trips: Rock Life in the Sixties"), incubated her poetry in Bolinas, Calif., in the '70s. "Hawthorne" is her homage to those poets and those times, when Bolinas was rife with poets and poetry in a thriving and spicy small-town culture.

After a stint in Los Angeles, she was an editor at Women of China magazine in Beijing in 2005, having taught college English in both Xiamen and Beijing. She was the 2013-14 Poet Laureate of Belfast, where she lives near Head of the Tides. Her poetry has been published in Chiron Review, Social Anarchism, Saturday Afternoon Journal, Dongxi, The Maine Review, Fredericksburg Literary and Art Review, Off The Coast and the 2016 anthology "Cross-Strokes," as well as the re-launch of Oculus Vox. She is the host of "Poetry Woodshed Radio" on WBFY in Belfast and a member of Beyond Baroque.

# LEAH GARCHIK Separating the beatniks from the hippies

Just because lawyer **Tony Serra's** aims are broad — he “perceives himself in the role of a warrior” for justice, says his firm’s website — that doesn’t mean he doesn’t pay attention to details. He emailed last week that he’d been invited to a preview for the “Summer of Love Experience” at the de Young Museum and was appalled that the invitation specified “Bohemian Chic Attire.”

“Our correlation to the ‘bohemians’ is/was the beatniks, an over-serious, self-important, rather dour bunch: no color, no song, no dance, no love. The Summer of Love involved not the bohemian beatniks, but the hippies! We wore tie-dye, long gowns and beautiful necklaces. We were flamboyant in color, we ran around half-naked, danced wildly and made love freely, all with flowers in our hair.”

Assuming that the museum’s board of trustees had decided on the dress code specification, Serra challenges them: “Did they skip the ‘60s? Do they disdain the hippie lifestyle? Did they ever visit the Haight? The Straight Theater? Did they ever drop acid? ... The de Young Experience is for hippies, not bohemians. See you there in tie-dye!”

I am expecting that Serra’s description of beatniks as “dour” won’t sit well with the “Howl” and “On the Road” crowd. And I am expecting his comments about the museums’ trustees won’t be music to their bejeweled ears, either. But you’ve gotta admire the spirit of a warrior with posies in his ponytail.

# WAYBACK MACHINE. Hippies’ ‘mill-in’ ties up traffic

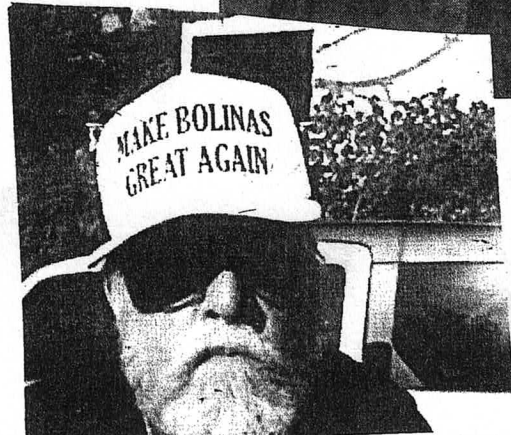
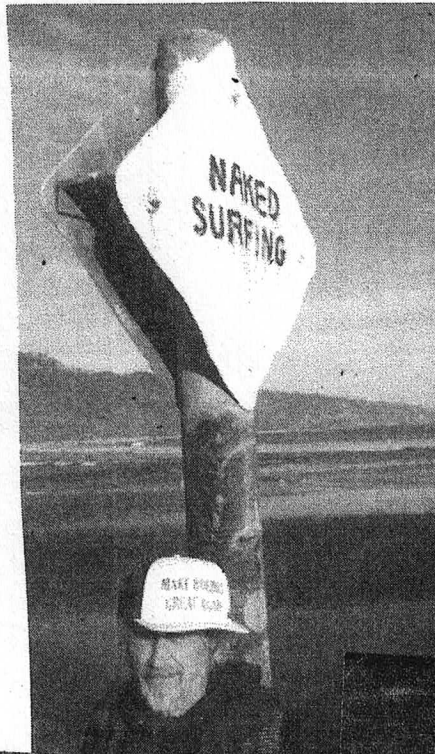
**Hippies add love to the Haight and Ashbury street signs.**

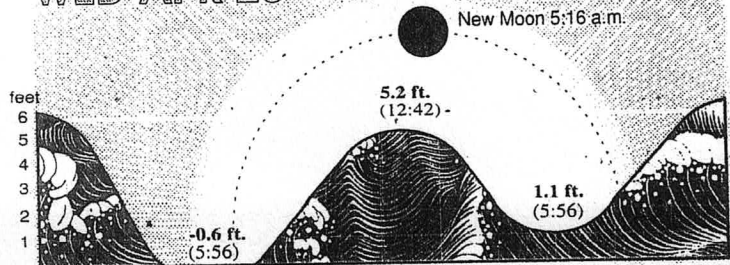
**March 27:** Hundreds of San Francisco’s hippies rose up yesterday and staged an Easter Sunday “mill-in” around the intersection of Haight and Ashbury Streets. Chanting “Streets are for people ... streets are for people,” they milled around and about the intersection for hours. Some sat down on the street and swarms of others played a new hippie version of “tie up the traffic” by continuously circling the intersection’s crosswalks. Squads of police converged on the chaotic scene when it erupted at 5 p.m. and tried to untangle it with a minimum of fuss. They moved with restraint at first, onlookers said, but the hip-

pie crowd — and the police — grew more hostile as the mill-in stretched on. Before three hours had gone by, an estimated dozen persons had been hauled off to waiting paddy wagons by police.

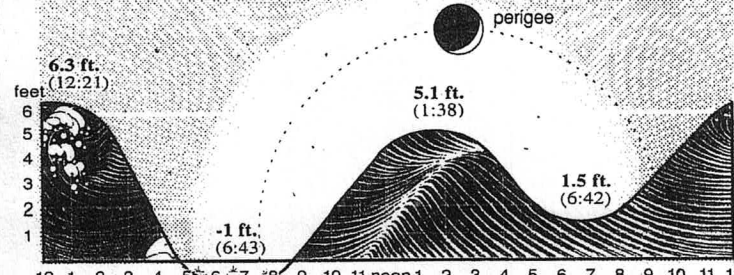
At one point, the hippies unleashed a psychedelic weapon — a barrage of worn out banana peels. The banana peels struck a police three-wheeler motorcycle without damage, onlookers reported, and without turning it on. Observers said the mill-in developed after two hippies began tossing a large plastic bottle back and forth across the street. This game slowed the flow of curious tourists through the intersection and hippies began stopping autos and telling tourists to “get out and turn on.” Hundreds of hippies quickly jammed the Haight-Ashbury intersection and hundreds of tourists pressed behind them. But a sort of cool and semi-cool hippie peace evolved around 5 p.m. “It was just hippies,” said Lieutenant Eugene Caldwell. “Just hippies acting like hippies.”
