Walk Your Art

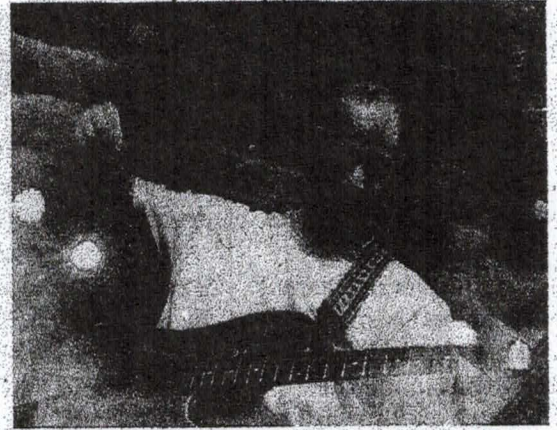

Tribute to the Dead at saloon in Bolinas

The spirit of the Grateful Dead lives on in too many things to count. It's reified through the music of spin-off bands like Dead & Company and appreciation nights that seek to embody the band's inventive and unpredictable energy, that glowing X factor.

In the Bay Area especially, its history seems to whistle everywhere.

But it's particularly alive at Smiley's Schooner Saloon, which claims to be the oldest saloon west of the Mississippi. By day, the bar is a staple of locality, an unfussy and dimly lit spot to play pool after a day at the beach. By night, it's a place to enjoy live music — and this weekend, music that manifests the staying power of the Grateful Dead.

On Saturday, March 30, the bar plans to host West Marin Grateful Dead Appreciation; a night dedicated to the music of the Dead. The musicians taking part include bassist and guitarist Alex Bleeker (Real Estate, Alex Bleeker and the Freaks), Nick Aives (Vetiver), Carol Ann Kreuger (member of several Grateful Dead tribute bands), Danny Vitali (Point Reyes songwriter), Dylan Squires (Haggards), and Jeff Manson (Night Bloom Records).

Vehicle dwelling directive shelved

A group of Bolinas residents rejected an effort by Marin supervisors Tuesday to respond to their concerns about people living in their vehicles on downtown streets.

Supervisors were poised to adopt an ordinance that would have made it possible for sheriff's deputies to ticket "automobiles" over 22 feet in length that park overnight on designated Bolinas streets. A number of Bolinas residents voiced their opposition to the ordinance, calling for a more restrictive regulation.

"I truly would not support this ordinance," said Bolinas resident Patricia Raven.

Jan Broek's Poetry

A brilliant idea for celebrating one's birthday: Invite your friends to come read the poetry you've written over the last 25 years. Each poem, individual in its own write (sic) is recited by a unique individual, resulting in a double whammy of meaning.

The two words that jumped out at me at the reading of Jan Broek's poetry were "sward" and "dharmakaya." The last word is from the Buddhist tradition and means "truth body" (the absolute basis of reality, from which all phenomena originate)

"Sward" is defined in the OED (Oxford English Dictionary) as a "field of short grass, a grassy field" (Jan Broek is a wordsmith and loves to use unusual and archaic words to spice up his poetry)

Rick was sitting in the audience at the reading and consulted his phone to find out the definition of "sward" He discovered an additional meaning of sward in the Urban Dictionary: "sward: to unfurl an epic diatribe of utter bullshit while being completely unaware that your existence has become an absolute joke to those around you"

Those two words, "sward" and "dharmakaya" summarize the essence of Jan Broek's poetry: to jump off the sward of absolute bullshit (a metaphor for the modern world) and plunge into the truth body of wisdom, the dharmakaya.

Such a daring leap of understanding is possible through poetry, which happens consistently with Jan Broek's poetry, where Love still reigns supreme, and family, friends and community outweigh the bullshit of the system.

utility vehicles and covered pickups all measure under 22 feet in length, residents pointed out.

"We think the ordinance is just going to change the story from having a few large vehicles to many smaller, moderately sized vehicles," said Bolinas resident Al Minrielle.

The supervisors tabled the idea. Supervisor Dennis Rodoni, who has been working for some time now to address Bolinas residents' concerns, cautioned that rejection of the ordinance could mean no change in the status quo over the summer.

Complicating the situation is the fact that parking restrictions in coastal villages such as Bolinas must be approved by the California Coastal Commission.

Rodoni helped craft Measure X, an advisory measure on the November 2018 ballot that proposed prohibiting the parking of large vehicles on Brighton Avenue, Park Avenue and Wharf Road in Bolinas between 11 p.m. and 5 a.m. The measure passed with 52 percent voter support.

"Measure X was not really about parking," said Bolinas resident Joyce Clements on Tuesday. "It was about saving the life of a community, about keeping a small village unique and intact."

Bolinas resident Michelle Sullivan said, "It's the people who are habitating and living in their vehicles for weeks and months at a time and using our town as their campground that is the problem. That is what we were really trying to address with Measure X."

Bruce Bowser said, "Bolinas is not a KOA. My neighbors and I are not campground staff. Most weekends are crowded fog or shine. Visitors circle endlessly seeking parking and there is none to be had. Bolinas residents can't park to get their mail or buy a loaf of bread."

The plan was to use ordinances that the supervisors passed in 2017 that give them the power to restrict the parking of oversized vehicles by neighborhood or even by street.

The ordinances were initially used to restrict overnight parking on portions of Woodland Avenue

and Auburn Street in the Lomita Park neighborhood, an unincorporated area bordering San Rafael that includes about 50 homes, a Montessori school and a seasonal freshwater marsh.

Later supervisors approved an identical overnight parking ban on oversized vehicles on North San Pedro Road from Meadow Drive to La Pasada Way, and on 15 additional streets and roads in Santa Venetia.

The county adopted its overnight bans after the city of San Rafael passed an ordinance prohibiting recreational vehicles and campers from parking for longer than one hour on city streets. After that, the recreational vehicles began migrating to Lomita Park.

"They're just moving the issue from one place to another instead of focusing on helping the people who are affected," said David Levin, managing attorney for Legal Aid of Marin. "These are people with no other housing options. We see some tragic stories."

The ordinances defined an oversized vehicle as a vehicle or combination of vehicles, trailer or auxiliary equipment with a commercial license plate and overall length of more than 22 feet. Automobiles, motorcycles and pickups, however, are exempt from the parking restrictions.

The ordinance supervisors were considering Tuesday would have gotten around that exemption by defining an "automobile" as a vehicle or combination of vehicles, trailer and/or auxiliary equipment with an overall length of no more than 22 feet.

The half-dozen Bolinas residents who spoke at Tuesday's meeting said 22 feet is too long.

Minrielle had two helpers hold the opposite ends of a 22-foot-long piece of string to illustrate the point for the supervisors.

"This is what a 22-foot vehicle would look like parked in a residential neighborhood," Minrielle said.

He suggested that supervisors should instead restrict the parking of any vehicle over 19 feet in length and 7 feet in height.

"We'll never stop camping entirely," Minrielle said, "but at least give us back our residential character."

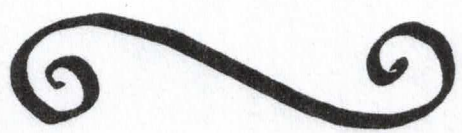


HOMETOWN 2019 soozy mills

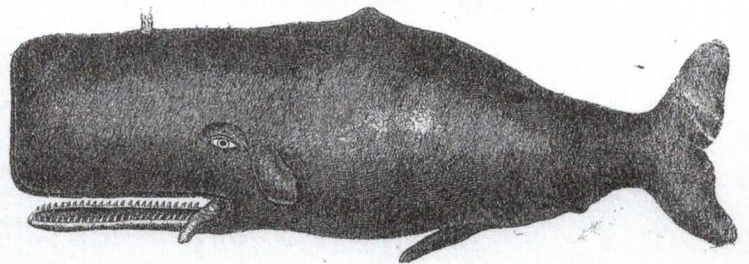
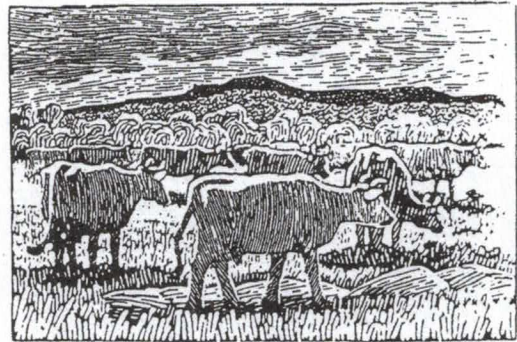

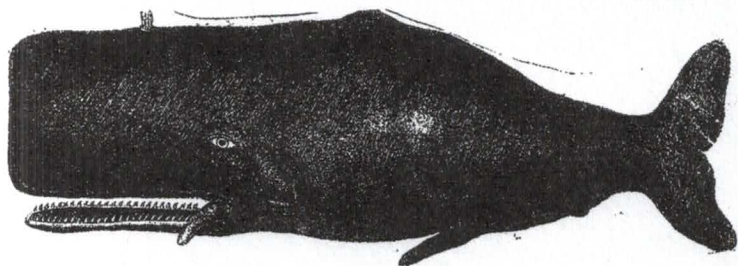
