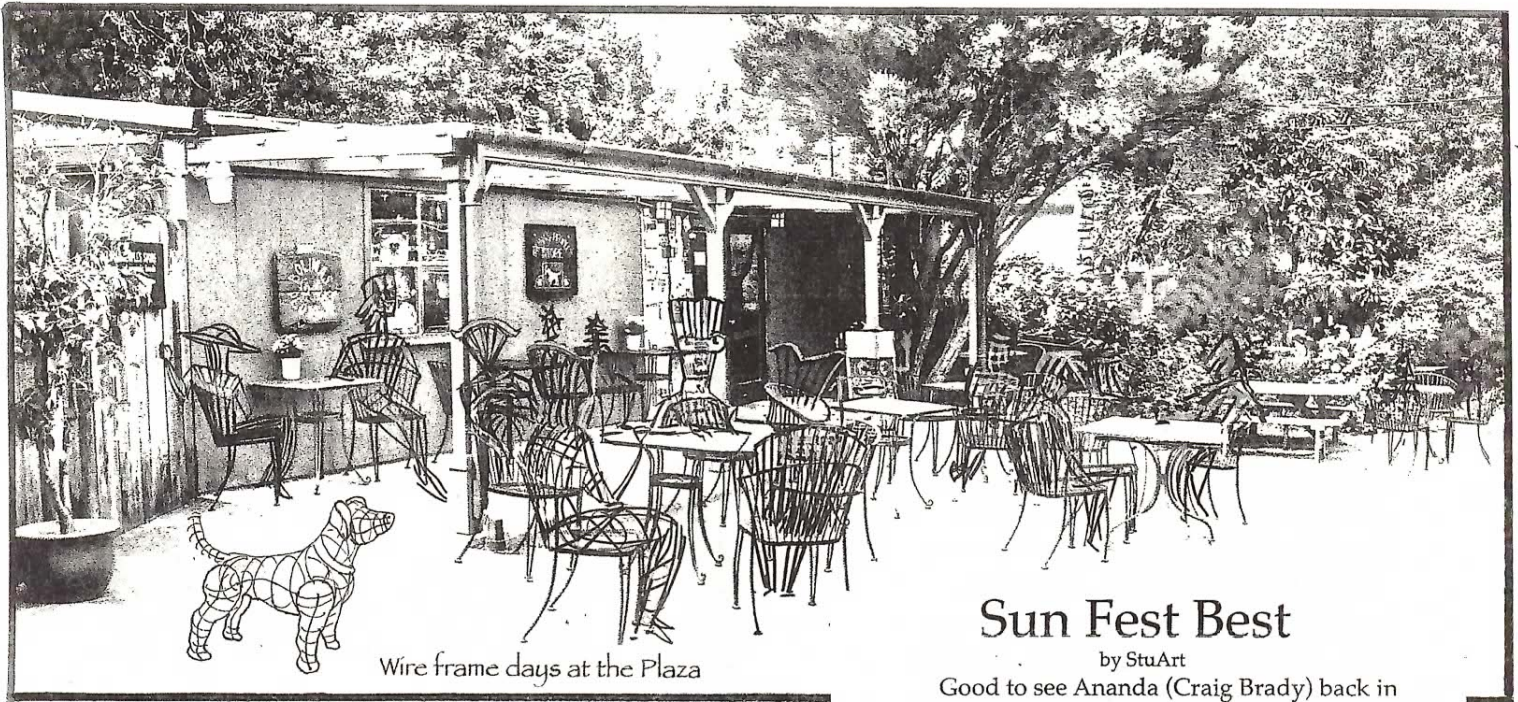

Good to see Ananda (Craig Brady) back in town after a four month sojourn in India. Ananda spent a month at Kumba Mehla and the rest of the time at the ashram of Mataji Narvada Puri. (Santosh Puri is the website)

Ananda tended the holy fire at the ashram, a fire that has been burning continuously for 50 years. He'd start it up with some dried cow dung at 4 in the morning, and then bank the coals at 8pm.

He said that the general attitude is more positive in India. Tragedy and death are more harmoniously woven into the fabric of life. Even though India is beset with all the problems and confusion of modernization, still the core of India is steadfast.

"It's all about shedding negativity" is what I heard him say when I asked him what he had learned. "Everything in my life has brought me to here."

Last Wednesday on the ides of May, while walking with my old friend from Tam Hi, Mimi Calpestri; I turned to her & asked, "Is John Barrow still alive?" She answered, "Yes, he is!". (Her daughter, Angela, & John's son, Jessie, had been married once, so I thought she would know). I had lost track of dear John after he moved to Texas . I had not thought about him probably for 30 YEARS! Mimi and I had just gone by the FIRST bulletin board that had been lag-screwed to the front of the General Store in the late 60's. John was the Master Craftsman that BUILT that board with his inscription carved beneath, that read: 'Every man, woman & child in this village, may enjoy, share, & be responsible for this board'.. I had been there the day John mounted that board. I was impressed by how thoughtful his gift was for our community! The board & inscription are still there! On Friday, the 17th of May, I was shocked by Harriet Kossman's article in the Hearsay News stating John's PASSING on May 11th in Berkeley! John's SPIRIT must have been making a visit to his old board for the THOUGHT to come through, so strongly, about HIM at that precise moment when Mimi & I .. were walking by his board! How connected we all are sometimes without even KNOWING it! John was a truly honorable, creative, human-being! The best way I can think to describe him is: He was 'like still waters, that ran silent, that ran deep!'

His first wife Lorraine, (Later renamed Tui) was a beautiful soul! She was my 1st yoga teacher in Bolinas; and she & John were our first good friends here in the sixties & early seventies. It was both an HONOR and a PRIVILEGE to have known the two of them....

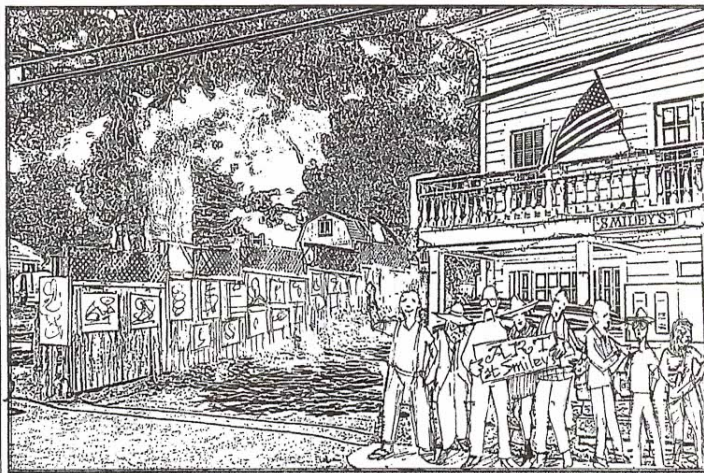

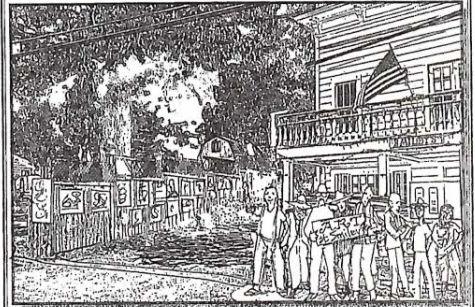
HUNGRY OWLS, OWLS OF MARIN
