And like the original Dead the benefit band had two drummers, Charlie Callahan and Jeff Warrin.

Danny Vitale added some great "Jerry jamming" on lead guitar.

Hearsay editor Jeff Manson did a terrific job of playing bass guitar in that unique Grateful Dead way that is more rollicking than rocking.

"Grateful Dead is so easy to dance to," someone said to me that evening. Indeed, when the floor was filled with dancers and the music was rocking, I mean rollicking, that special Grateful Dead magic happened, and we all were transported to a beautiful, utopian CommUnity.
