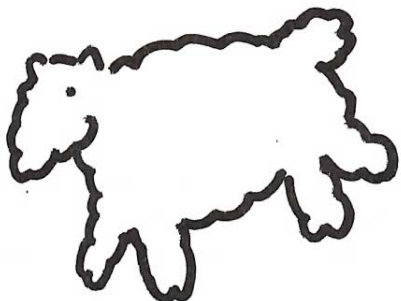

Dances with Wools

It was a pleasant surprise to see Patricia Brceno's new work in the Coastal Artists Gallery at the Museum. I'm well acquainted with Patricia's beautiful knitting and felting, hats and clothing, but her explorations of fine art abstractions using felted wool are something else.

The delicacy of the strands of wool evokes sumi-e brush painting and fine calligraphy. It's an organic world of wool ranging from macro scale (tree roots and branches) to micro (corpuscles and mitochondria)

Patricia "paints" with a diverse palette of fibers. In "Topography" for instance she used Mulberry silk, Wensleydale wool, Icelandic wool, carbonized bamboo, baste bambo, silk fabric and merino wool.

"Topography" is a beautiful concoction and I love the way Patricia worked the edges of her "canvas." I was reminded of Arthur Okamura's admonition, "pay attention to the edges, that's where the action is."

Also on exhibit at the Museum in the photography gallery are black and white photos of China and Japan by Alfred Palmer, who is best known for his photos of America's home front during WW2. The complexity of the scenes of historic China made me wonder what it was like today.

"Through Palmer's artistic eye we glimpse both the old way of life and the coming modernization." (from the commentary at the exhibit)

That theme, the old way and modernization, followed me as I visited the map exhibit in the history room and then the historical paintings in the main gallery. Some of the paintings pictured the Bolinas Mesa with no trees or buildings. Others showed the Stinson sandspit with no houses. I was struck by the quaint simplicity of the old way.

"We appreciate impermanence in Bolinas." Elia said to me. "There's one painting, not in the exhibit, that shows the cliffs the way they were 100 years ago."

"Still," she continued, "If you look at the map of the protected land in West Marin, it's incredible how much has been left unchanged. It took a lot of work to keep it the way it is."

"Yes," I agreed. "Rebels with a cause."

"It's a great film." Elia commented, immediately picking up on my reference. "I hope everyone gets to see it"

"Rebels With a Cause" will be shown at the Community Center on May 18.

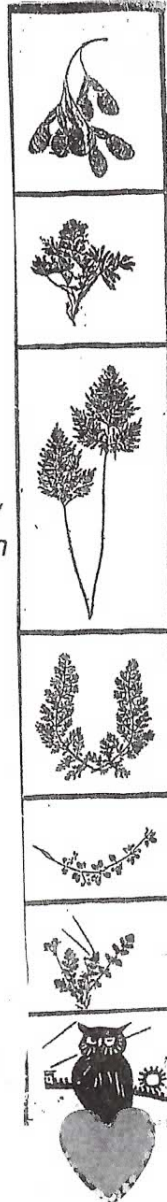

And the Wharf Road Flower box has sprung along with it in a riot of colorful blooms. There are nemesias (fragrant ones!), happy-faced violas, cheerful marguerites, daisies, million bells, candytufts, statis...plus there are California & Oriental poppies coming up, planted in the new moon last March...

Last year this box, which had been so beautifully maintained for so many years, seemed completely abandoned and desolate. She was so happy we had gone ahead and resurrected the box! "To see the box in bloom was like a 'heart connection' to my Mother!", she said. She explained that she lived in Berkeley, and her sisters lived in various towns around the Bay; that she had taken a look when the box was so forlorn, and was aghast with all the poison oak growing in it. She said to herself, "How do I do this?" (Our dear friend Jen Meyer, who is immune to it, pulled it out!) She wanted to give us money for the plants we had put in; I said, "No, really, this is a gift of love for our town,



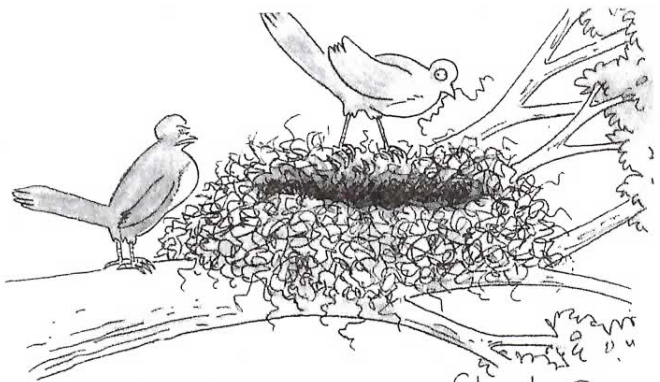

We were so thankful that she was pleased, and that our meeting with her was so agreeable!

Then he said, "It's our job to beautify the Earth, isn't it?" I smiled at him & nodded. I was pleasantly surprised to hear such 'sweet words' coming from such a strapping young male! So many gracious encounters happen in our inter-action with people, walking to the beach, when we are tending the flower box! This exchange of good energy is more than reward for our combined efforts for reviving and caring for the box!

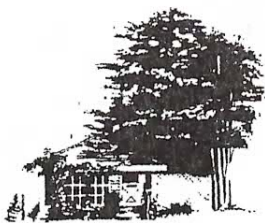

The statewide "March in March" event was inspired by professional surfer and MMA fighter Dustin Barca, in partnership with the Hawaii GMO Justice Coalition. Barca's intention was to bring awareness to GMOs and chemical testing conducted by Monsanto and other biotech companies throughout Hawaii, pointing out that "everything we love is in serious danger — our children, our land and our ocean."

Thousands gathered to voice their concerns; the five-island demonstration opened on Oahu, continued on Kauai, Hawaii Island, Maui, and concluded here on Molokai.

"I felt a sense of togetherness like nothing I have ever been a part of before," said Molokai father Jay Duquette....

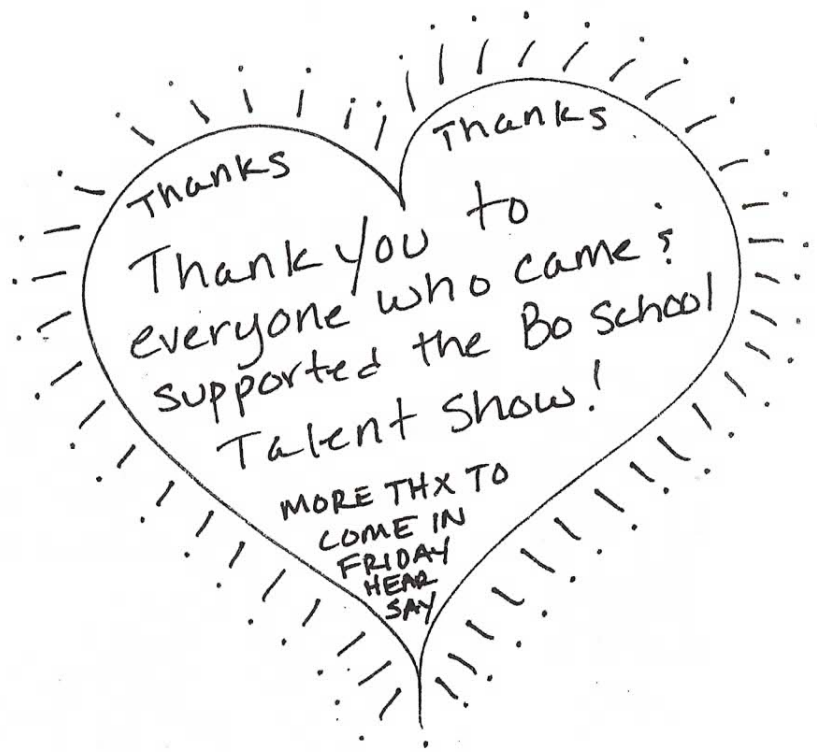

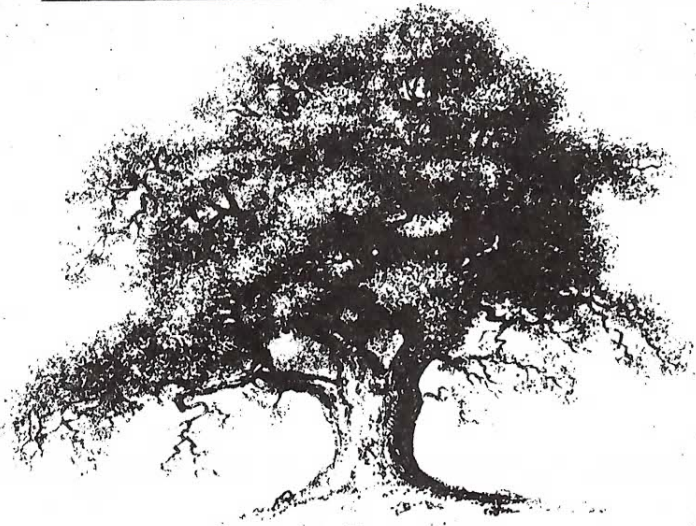

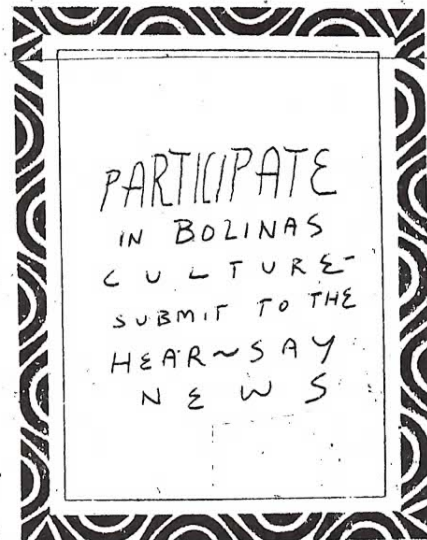
