**Twenty Years with Midnight on the Water**

A Recollection by Avis Licht

One day, about 20 years ago, a group of friends who played music together, went "over the hill" to hear a concert by a famous Irish fiddler, Martin Hayes. There they met me and invited me to come to Bolinas and play music with them. Truly, it was like a dream come true for me. At last I had found a group of musicians to play together regularly. Believe me, that's not so easy to find.

These folks had started playing at Liz Tuomi's. Ned Riley- fiddle, Jennie Pfeiffer – concertina and percussion, Liz – piano, Linda Weyrick – fiddle, Sadja Greenwood – flute and penny whistle, Lewie Likover – fiddle and mandolin, Hawk Weston – guitar, and voice, and me, Avis Licht – fiddle, mandolin and voice. After Liz left, Maryellen O'Connell joined us on piano and harp. For more than 20 years we got together almost every Wednesday to play tunes. After Liz died, which was tragic for all of us, we met at Hawk's, who has provided delicious food, and often full meals, every week.

In the beginning, we played just for ourselves. But as the years went by, we wanted to share our music and it turned out folks wanted to hear it. Weddings, community events, Farmer's Market, celebrations - we were thrilled to be able to play our tunes in public. Our monthly gig at Smiley's was always a wonderful time for us, celebrating birthdays of the month, singing Ananda's birthday song and eating cake.

I call *Midnight on the Water* a musical burrito. Each part of a burrito is simple – a tomato, beans, cheese, tortillas. But when you put it all together - well, you've got a great meal. Like a burrito, together we were more than the sum of our parts.

Well, time changes everything. Lewie passed away last year, Sadja is moving to Portland. On Wednesday May 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2018 we will be playing our last gig at Smiley's. We hope you can come down for any part or all of the evening.

Finally, I want to shout out a big THANK YOU! to all my fellow band members for hanging in there all these years and to the wonderful folks who have come to listen to us. We love it when you dance to our tunes.

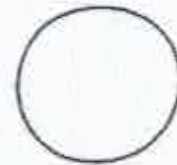

### JOANNA MACY LIGHTS THE WAY

*'One of the penalties of an ecological education is that one lives alone in a world of wounds.'* - Aldo Leopold, *A Sand County Almanac*, 1949

Eco-philosopher Joanna Macy, PhD came all the way from back east (Berkeley) to Commonweal on Sunday to talk about "The Wisdom of Our Ecological Grief." About 200 people showed up to see and hear her. That didn't surprise us, as she is widely renowned, even revered. Over 17 years ago I spent five days at Spirit Rock center in Woodacre in a retreat for activists of various types, and never forgot how learned, committed, and inspiring she was. It seemed time to ask her to come to Commonweal's New School series, and she graciously agreed.

If one reads her memoir "Widening Circles" (the title comes from the poet Rilke, whom she has expertly translated and published), she becomes even more impressive. Enduring a poor and even abusive upbringing during the Great Depression and WWII, she excelled at school and escaped to college and a Fulbright Fellowship in Europe, where she not only studied but traveled widely, including wandering North Africa on her own. Recruited into the CIA (!), she then lived around the world with her Peace Corps director husband, raising three children. When her son brought home a school paper on nuclear pollution, she awoke to environmental threats and became a committed activist. Many books, actions, travels, and countless seminars and classes later, she is known worldwide for her teachings on how to live in the impending eco-apocalypse without succumbing to despair or denial. The first words in her landmark book *World as Lover, World as Self* are "Life on our planet is in trouble," and the rest is about what to do about that, and not necessarily alone.

Her talk was videoed and will be posted on the Commonweal New School site before too long, so no need to recount it here, even if that were possible. Suffice it to say that James Stark introduced us in a heartfelt, even tearful manner that showed how powerful her teachings had been for him and his own pioneering work at Commonweal's Regenerative Design Institute. Then she spoke, the whole gathering rapt, and at the end let it drop that her birthday was coming, stage-whispering "I will be eighty-nine!" The room erupted into a standing ovation, and then into the standard "Happy Birthday" song - interrupted partway by the local contingent, singing Ananda's more bolsterous version.

It was truly... beautiful.

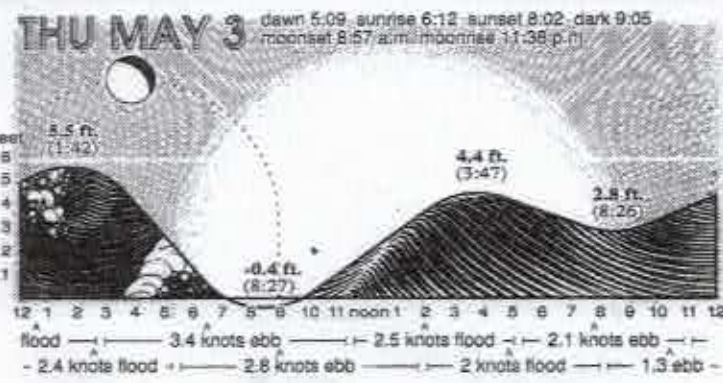
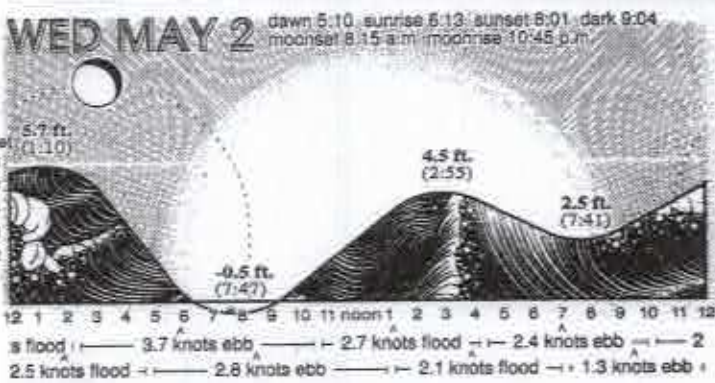

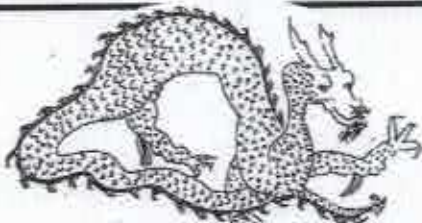
