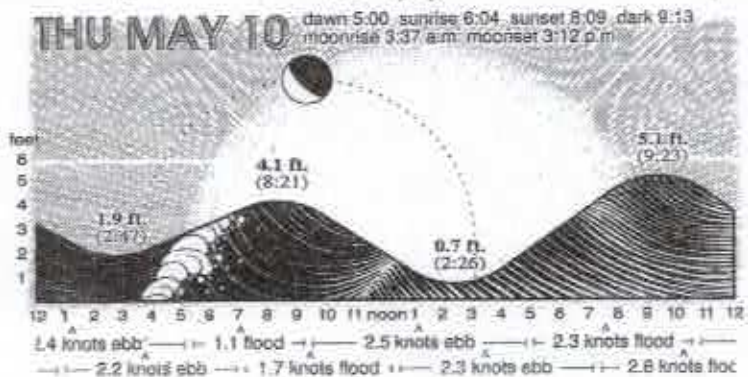
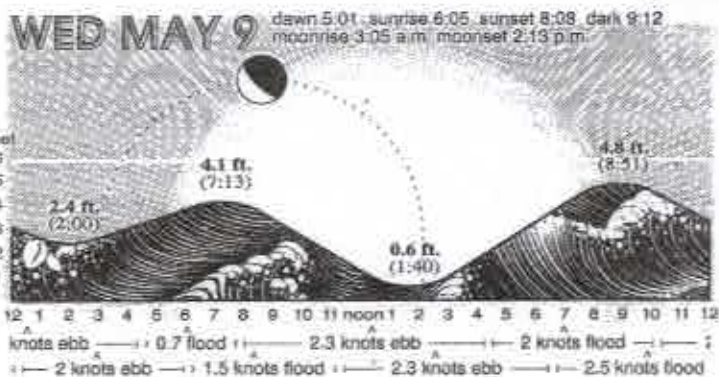

SADJA GREENWOOD, MD*(A small tribute read at her farewell luncheon at Commonweal)*

There is a Commonweal New School talk podcast featuring Sadja that I think should be required listening; among many things, we talked about her 2013 novel "Changing the Rules", which is really more of an autobiography in disguise. As she described it, *"This novel is set in the 1950s: romance, bohemian life (before the Beatniks), medical school, sex, illegal abortion (safe or deadly), and a young woman's journey to find her calling. It's a cautionary tale for today."*

Cautionary indeed - and this was BEFORE the last presidential election. And a couple years back I talked Sadja into co-authoring an article on immunization, or lack thereof due to misinformation and myths, that appeared in three Marin publications, starting with the *Hearsay News*. Her expertise and long experience was invaluable - but of course that article resulted in us being called liars, corrupt skills for Big Pharma, idiots, and worse. You're welcome, Sadja!

And finally, one time I took an old friend, who long ago ran a women's clinic in the city, to catch *Midnight on the Water* at Smiley's. She watched them joyously crank out the Celtic tunes and then turned to me and said "I swear, that woman playing looks just like Dr. Sadja Greenwood, but it just can't be? She's one of my heroes!" I said it was Sadja indeed. Then I got called a liar *again*.

And Sadja's bio from the Commonweal talk:

*Sadja Greenwood received an MD from Case Western Reserve University and an MPH from the University of California, Berkeley. She was an assistant clinical professor in the Department of Obstetrics, Gynecology, and Reproductive Sciences at the University of California Medical School in San Francisco. She worked at Planned Parenthood in San Francisco where she started one of the first Teen Clinics in the United States in 1968, in response to the "summer of love." She started an abortion clinic at San Francisco Planned Parenthood immediately after the Supreme Court's 1973 decision in Roe v. Wade. She also worked for the International Planned Parenthood Federation in Singapore and in family planning in Latin America, Bangladesh, and Africa. She made a teaching film, *Aspiration Abortion Without Cervical Dilation*, in 1973 with her mentor and colleague, Alan Margolis, MD. The film was widely used to teach medical techniques for safe abortion. She is the author of *Menopause, Naturally* (Volcano Press, 1996), which became a popular book for women seeking alternatives to hormone therapy. She published a novel, *Changing the Rules*, in 2013, which is available at bookstores and at Amazon.com. She is a longtime Bolinas resident and plays in the renowned local celtic group, *Midnight on the Water*.*

BOBBIE LOUISE HAWKINS By Steve Ratcliffe

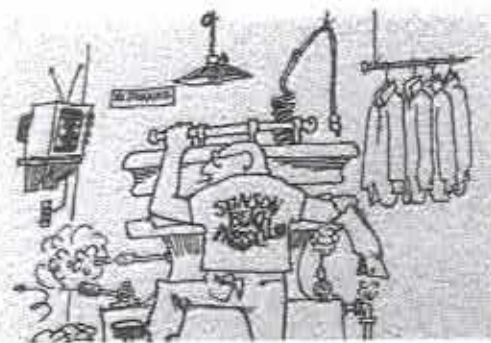
Bobbie Louise Hawkins (July 11, 1930 - May 4, 2018), writer and artist and great presence here in Bolinas in the 70's and 80's, was married to Robert Creeley and lived in the white farm house on Terrace. Here's her story "I Owe You One," (from "Frenchy and Cuban Pete & Other Stories" published by Michael Wolfe's Tomboctou Press in Bolinas in 1977) which she read at the Community Center on June 27, 1980 (a full moon night) -

I OWE YOU ONE

Before it gets lost into the void I want to tell about a letter that got written to the Denver Post years ago. It could have been as long ago as 1947 or 1948. It was apparently written in answer to a letter that had been written earlier and, judging by this letter, the earlier one seems to have been written by a woman who was complaining that when her husband got drunk he'd knock her around. The woman who wrote the letter I read said that she had the same problem. She said she only weighed about a hundred pounds and her husband weighed close to two hundred pounds. She said for years he'd go out on Friday night and Saturday night and get drunk and then he'd come home and beat her up, then he'd fall asleep on the bed with his clothes on. There came a night when he beat her up and when he had stopped she said, "I owe you one." When he fell asleep she went outside and brought in a piece of two by four and she started pounding on him with it. Of course, he woke up right away, and he beat her up again. And she said, "I owe you one." She said that in no time at all she had him afraid to go to sleep. Then he began to see that it was ok to go to sleep if he hadn't beat her up. So he stopped. Considering the number of years it had gone on the stopping was really quick. She said she hoped that her own solution would encourage the other woman to look for a solution because it was not hopeless. The two principles involved were consistency and perseverance.
