A BLESSING OF OUR WATER

The public access point for Arroyo Hondo creek is on land stewarded by Point Blue Conservation Science, originally established as the Pt. Reyes Bird Observatory (PRBO) in 1965.

The Pt. Blue Palomarin Field Station, at 999 Mesa Rd, is an important site for research and the monitoring of changes – both natural and human-created – in resident and migratory bird populations, which is used to inform conservation efforts.

It is also a training arena for biology interns and an educational site which welcomes visitors, in particular school children, to observe science in action and wild birds up close.


Exiting from the large parking lot, and outside of the gridded monitoring area, is a beautiful nature trail that leads down to Arroyo Hondo. There, a bridge crosses over the creek and the trail leads up to an area known as "Miwok Meadows".

While many of the areas adjacent to the creek are recovering from previous human disturbance, the ravine cut by the creek is so steep that this Riparian zone appears to have not been disturbed, hence the presence of some very old trees and extraordinary, intact habitat.

On the other side of the creek, in an area known as "Miwok Meadows", there exists the remnant of a shell mound, indicating that it was very likely once a habitation site for The First People.

Please join us on Sunday, June 21st, at 9 AM, to walk the trail down to the creek to bless the primary source of water for our town. We'll continue up through Miwok Meadows, making a loop back to the parking lot.

And, thanks to Pt. Blue, for graciously welcoming us to do so.

WANT TO KNOW ABOUT (OUR) WATER?

Two watersheds are responsible for providing our water: the Arroyo Hondo Watershed and the Woodrat Watershed.

BCPUD has had water rights on Arroyo Hondo since 1925. The entire watershed lies within a heavily forested region of the Pt. Reyes Seashore, and is owned by the United States of the Interior (National Park Service). There is limited public access to the downstream portions of the watershed and, using the District's maintenance road, to the raw water intakes up creek. Access above the intakes is limited by dense vegetation. The entire watershed is approximately 2.3 sq. miles and is steeply sloped.

The Woodrat Watershed contains 2 unnamed streams which flow through moderately steep to rolling terrain feeding Woodrat #1 and Woodrat #2 reservoirs. 28.79 acres at the Woodrat #1 site, and 27.29 acres at the Woodrat #2 site are owned by the BCPUD, with the remainder owned by the Dept. of the Interior. These reservoirs were constructed in 1977 and 1979, respectively. Hiking trails through pastureland to the ocean skirt the Woodrat Watershed, but both reservoirs are fenced off and there is no public access (or grazing) in the watershed proper.

The mean annual precipitation at the lower elevation of the watersheds is 28 – 32 inches per year.

CALLING all REPORTERS to HEARSAY NEWS TV!

Remember when Radio Free Bolinas used to broadcast Bolinas Public Utility District Meetings "live" from the studio upstairs at 240 Elm Road so that we could listen at home to local government at work on our behalf? Remember how exciting it was to drive to Elm and Maple and sit in the car in the parking lot listening to the broadcast, so that when something of deep personal interest came up, we could hear the car door slam as Mark Maser (for instance) stormed into the meeting, or Gregg Hewlett stormed out.

I've been thinking, maybe now's the time for "HEARSAY NEWS TV."

It's pretty straightforward. Anyone – for instance, a reporter with a cell phone -- can easily and simply broadcast a meeting or other event "live" and in "real time", which can then be viewed elsewhere in real time on a cell phone or computer or tv set. You just need to know the address of the broadcast. No recording is made. Nothing has to be downloaded or uploaded. It all happens "live". I have been playing with an app named PERISCOPE which broadcasts through the @hearsay_news TWITTER account, and it's pretty easy to do.

Consider the common good and the positive public work currently being done by numerous governmental and social agencies and individuals in town – the BCPUD, The Bolinas Stinson Union School District, The Fire Protection District, The Whitecaps, The Community Center, art galleries, book clubs, classes, birdwatchers, plein air painters, surfers, music recitals, and public gatherings of all sorts, including town hall meetings -- which might could find a wider and appreciative audience of shut-ins, isolates and other homebound residents, new and old, via HEARSAY NEWS TV.

I have some organizational thoughts on how to make this technology work to the benefit and betterment of our community. If you are interested in any aspect of this possibility, shoot me an email – bolinashearsaynews@gmail.com. Try to talk me out of it. This is only the beginning.

Gallery Review

The group show at the Bolinas Gallery is well worth a look.

Tom Dibblee's plein air paintings in oil are suffused with the golden glow of peaceful serenity. I noticed that he rarely painted the sky blue. "The blue color of the sky is too cool," he answered me. "I prefer warm colors, unless it's a nocturne."

Tom pointed to a recent set of plein air "sketches" from the Adirondacks. "Rugged mountains," he commented. "No ocean but lots of lakes."

A self portrait sculpture by Kirk Kirkham, larger than life-size in unglazed red bisque, became animated when Kirk placed his glasses on the sculpture. I thought it a novel approach and then noticed that Kirk had already done something similar when he placed a Giants ball cap on another portrait sculpture. "I gave it many coats of acrylic medium," Kirk said.

Kirk told me how raku firing results in interesting and unpredictable glaze effects. I liked the matte dark grey glaze on the Native American's face. "All my sculptures are modelled from life," Kirk added.

Steve showed some new work. He drags boulders out of dredge sites on the Trinity River, hauls them to his studio and carves animal forms out of the granite. Then he sands and polishes the form and leaves the rest of the rock raw. Lately he's been sculpting and polishing the dorsal ridges and fins of whales and orcas.

The surprise at the group show was the beautiful oil paintings of water by Mary.

"I'm a surfer and I'm in love with the water," she told me. Her love comes through her art which undulates and bubbles forth from the canvases. "I work from photographs that I take," she explained to me.

"I'm usually in the water at dawn and out by 9:30 - the Dawn Patrol."

Check out the undulating color in her painting "Dawn Patrol." And I also liked her painting "Lost at C", a split screen tribute to a lost ukulele.

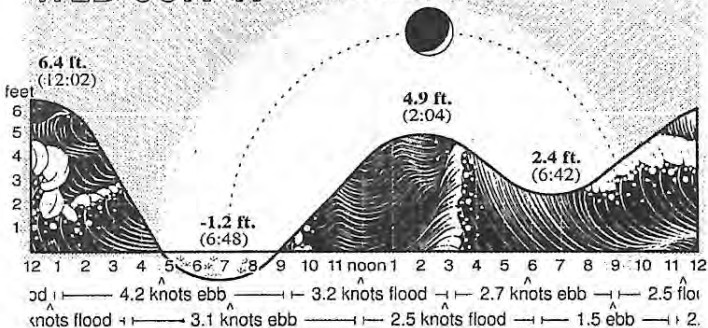

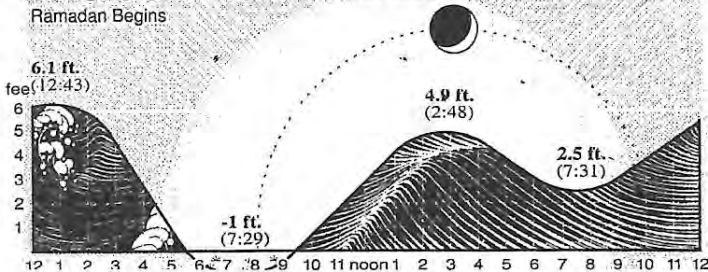
