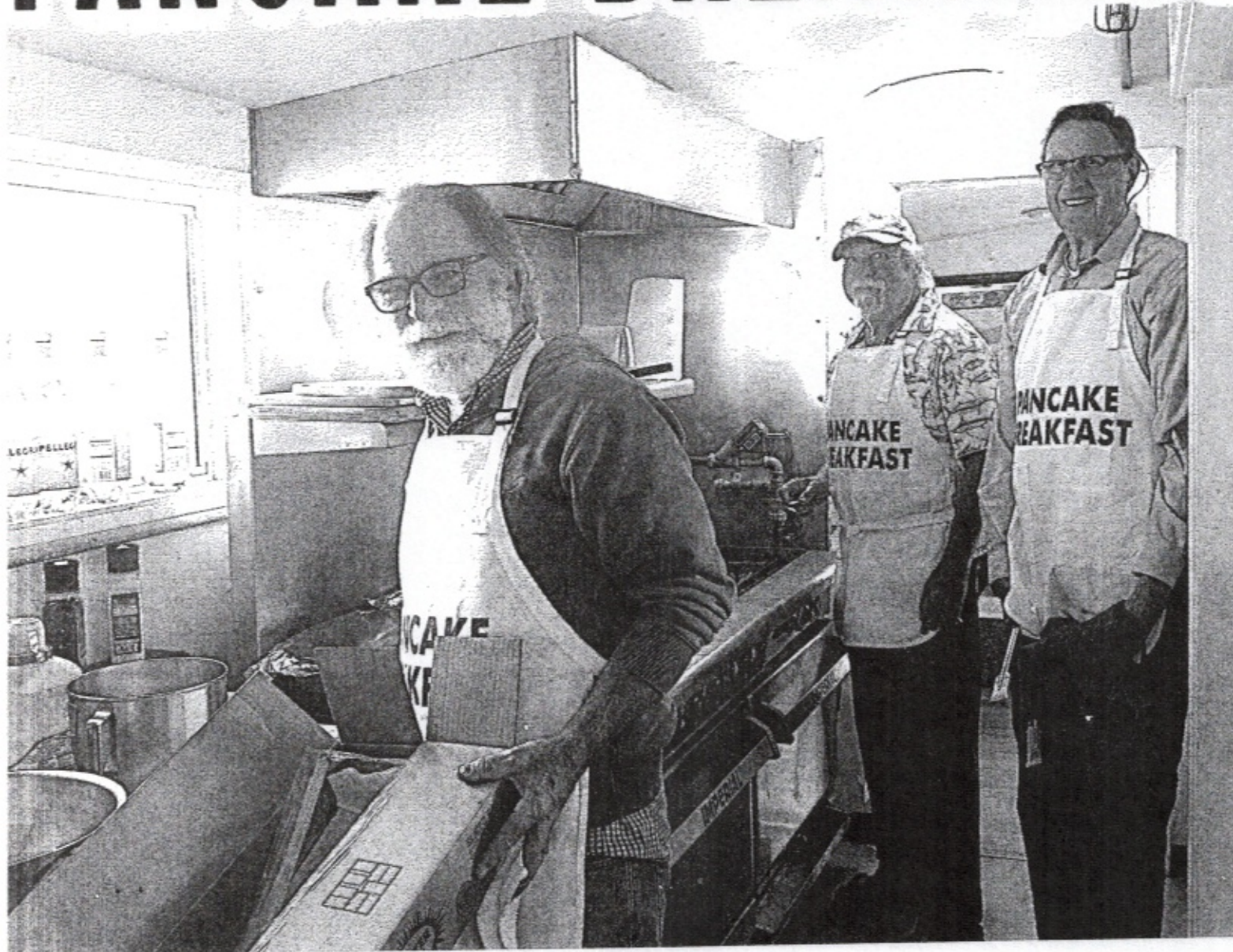

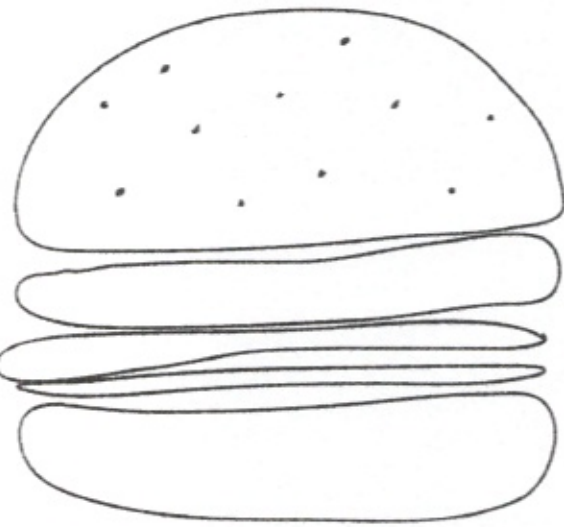

Joanna Macy at Commonweal was absolutely thrilling. She spoke at an all-day conference on Resilience in the Face of the Coming Collapse of civilization.

Joanna's answer was gratitude. "Gratitude is a revolutionary act. What the world asks of us is our full presence and a tool for that is gratitude. Gratitude is independent of external circumstances."

Joanna recommended honoring our pain for the world. "Suffering with" is more appropriately called compassion. Compassion is heart opening and "the heart that breathes open can hold the whole universe."

"When liberated from the sequestration of self and the lonely cowboy ego, deep ecology and deep time become playmates."

There are three stories we can tell ourselves: #1 - Industrial Growth Society, #2 - The Great Unraveling, #3 - The Great Turning in a Life-sustaining Society. About the last story Joanna adds "we can find our way into that great, exciting drama." She gave a hint about technique for addressing the Great Turning: "To speak is fine, but best through ritual, speaking in an archetypal voice from this moment."

Joanna closed by reciting a poem by Rilke, "Last Sonnet to Orpheus."

*Quiet friend who has come so far,
Feel how your breathing makes more space around you.
Let this darkness be a bell tower and you the bell;
And as you ring, what batters you becomes your strength,
Swaying back and forth into the change.*

*What's it like, this intensity of pain?
If the drink is bitter, turn yourself to wine.
In this uncontainable darkness,
Be the mystery at the crossroads of your senses –
The meaning discovered there.*

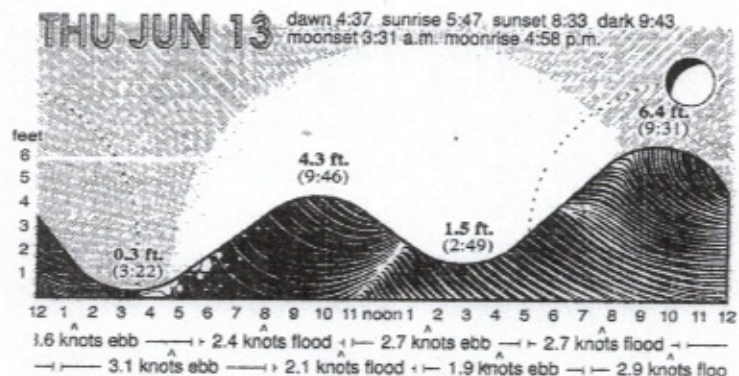
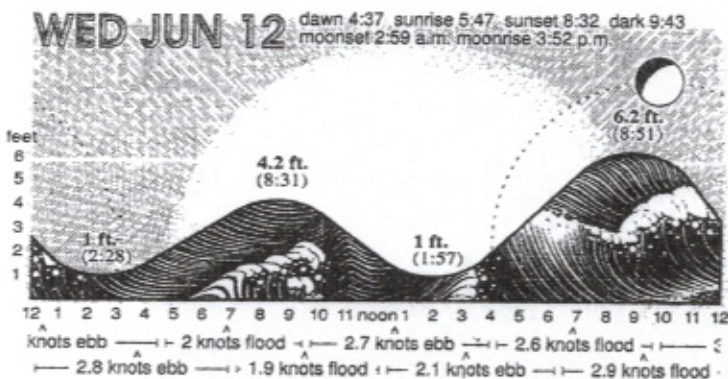
