## E Pluribus Bolinus

Back in '95 I had the urge to print yet another commemorative t-shirt for Bolinas. I wanted to commemorate the 4th of July in Bolinas, and I was looking in a Dover book and found a nice 19th Century engraving of a patriotic American eagle. In its talons the eagle held a banner. Written on it was "E Pluribus Unum," the motto of the United States. Roughly translated from Latin "E Pluribus Unum" means "The many are united into one."

On a whim I decided to change the inscription to "E Pluribus Bolinus."

I intentionally misspelled the name so it looked more like a Latin inscription. Plus I liked the inclusive nature of "us." About that time I had a dream about an ancient lost tribe regathering in Bolinas for the final days. I had done some artwork around the idea of the Lost Tribe of Bolinas, and I was delighted when I saw that "E Pluribus Bolinus" could be translated as: "Out of the multitude the Lost Tribe finds itself."

I made a silkscreen of the design and arranged with Cypress to have a silkscreen party at her house a week before the 4th of July. Cypress, Maud and Willie helped me silkscreen a bunch of t-shirts, flags, towels, sheets and pillowcases. We had all of the bushes and plants around Cypress' house festooned with "E Pluribus Bolinus" silkscreen prints drying in the sun. It was inspiring to see the abundant bounty of "E Pluribus" eagles. It was logo mania at its best. It was corporate branding at a funky, home-grown level.

I also knew there had to be a song there: "E Pluribus Bolinus" was too good a lyric hook to pass up. Sure enough, on the Fourth, surrounded by the "E Pluribus" eagles, amidst the chaos of firecracker explosions and drunks yammering, I hammered out a simple accompanying tune on my guitar:

*E Pluribus Bolinus, E Pluribus Bolinus,  
E Pluribus Bolinus, Bolinus, Bolinus*



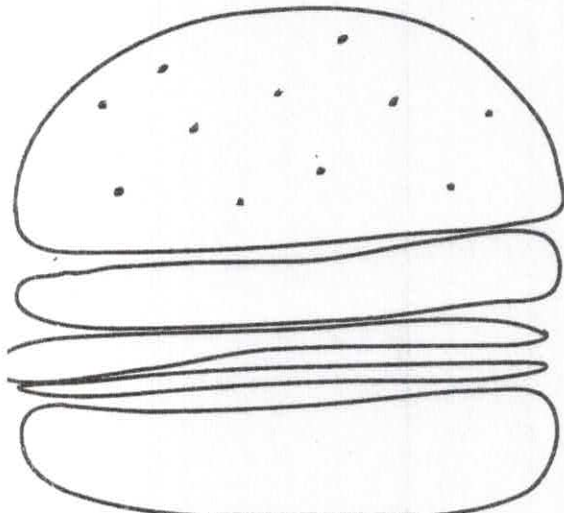

**BOLINAS FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT  
PUBLIC ROADS FIRE REDUCTION PROGRAM**

The fire hazard to Bolinas should be no surprise to anyone who lives here. One of the most critical and hazardous areas of concern is the fuel loading (trees, brush and grass) along the sides of our roads. The Bolinas Fire Department has identified the most critical roads on the Mesa (see diagram): These are the larger arteries that everyone will use while evacuating in the event of a large fire.

The roads highlighted in yellow are the responsibility of Marin County. The fuels along these roads are maintained by the County. The roads highlighted in red are not maintained by Marin County. Historically, the fuels along these roads have been maintained by a mix of individuals, neighborhood groups, and sometimes, the BCPUD.

The Bolinas Fire Department is initiating a program whereby we will reduce fuel along these critical roads. In addition to fire department staff, we will be using local, private contractor(s) to mow the grass and reduce the brush along the sides of these roads. The minimum width that would be required to have a fire engine pass a vehicle going the other way is 20 ft. This width would ensure that we could go towards the fire while at the same time have residents evacuate the area in the other direction.

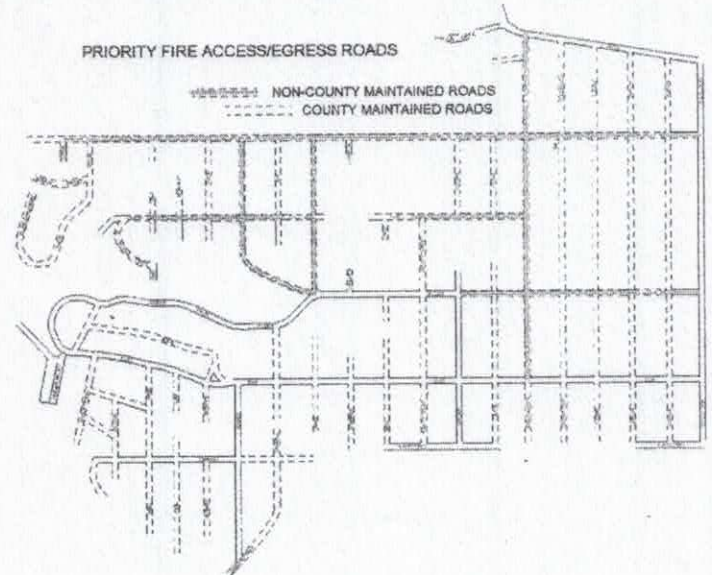
This is the minimum width that we will be using to identify areas that need fuel reduction. Many areas are already wider than 20 ft. In these areas, we may simply have the grasses cut short. Some areas are not wide enough for our engines to pass without the brush scraping along the sides. In these areas, we will be doing more aggressive cutting.

In addition to egress and access, reducing fuels along the sides of the roads will help slow the spread of any fire that may start along the side of a road. Also, a fire burning along the side of a road with well maintained fuels will be passable while a fire burning in five or six ft tall brush will prevent vehicles from using that road.

We have spoken to local ornithologists about the birds that may be living in the brush. We will be starting this program after the nesting season.

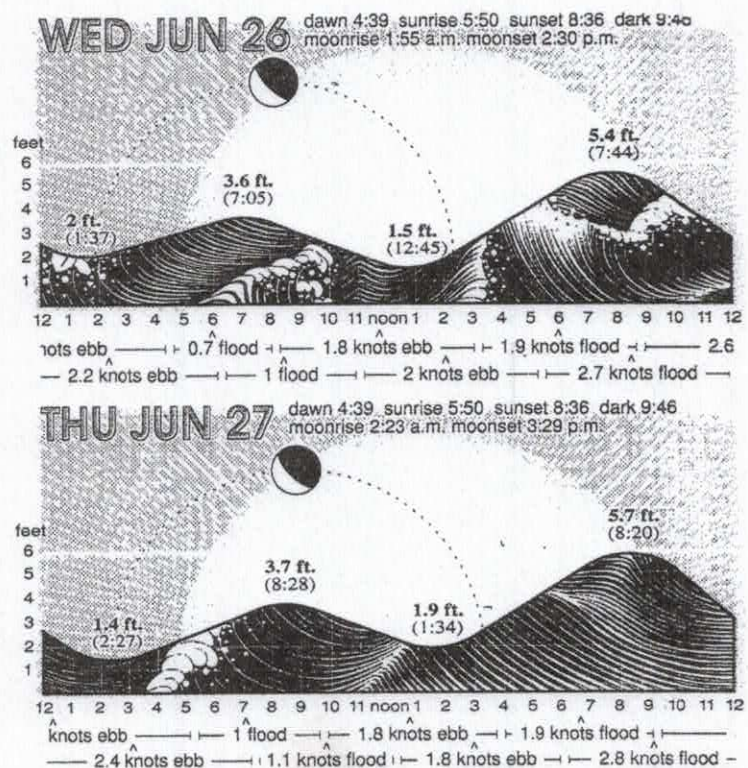
We will be advertising in the Hearsay, on bulletin boards, and have roadside signage up to make residents aware of when and where we will be working. Our goal is to work with the residents along these roads to minimize the impacts of our work. We would like to have any cars moved away from the work area on the days that we are working.

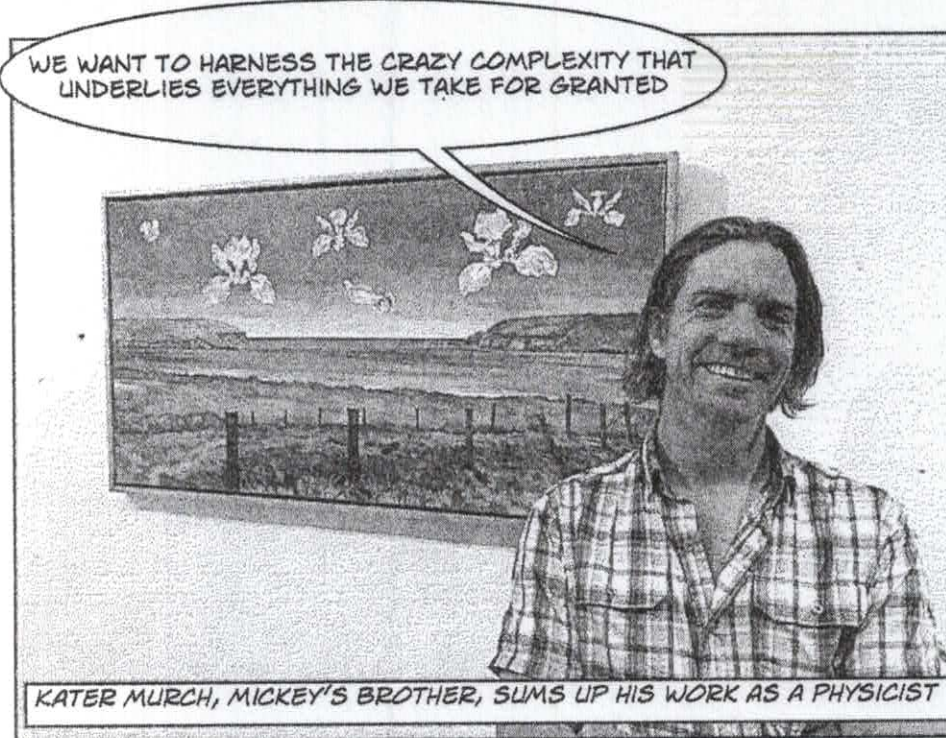

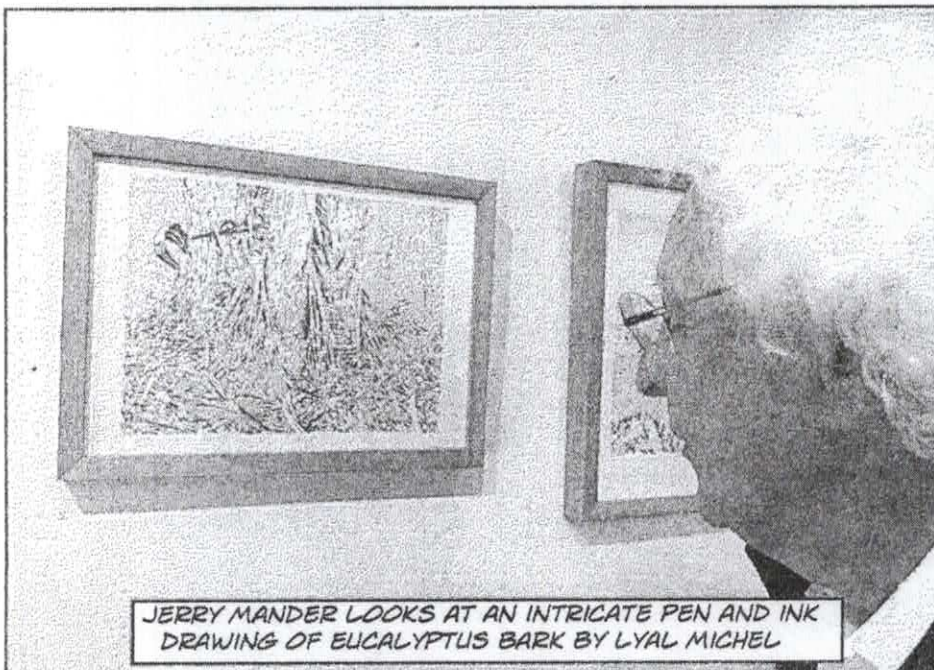
