Dear Community

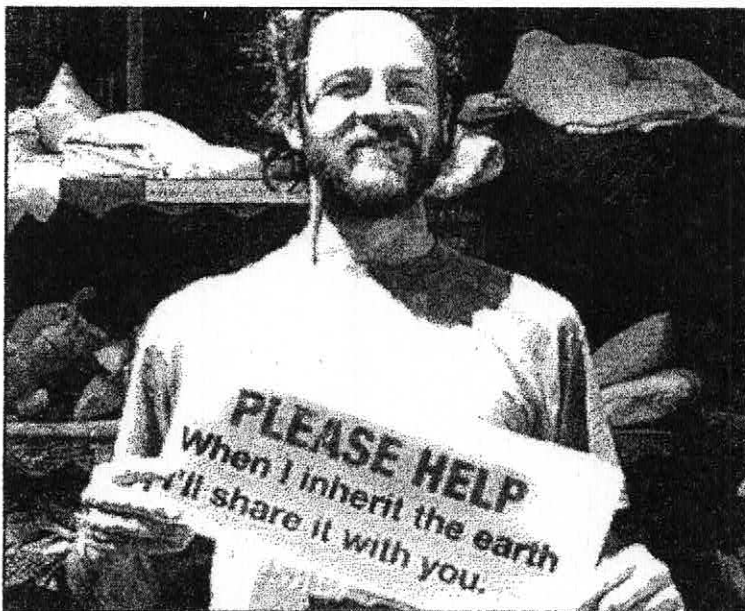
I would like to personally respond to Malcolm Ponder's letter about me, and the BCLT in both the Hearsay and the Point Reyes Light.

For some reason I have been branded a "developer" and I am assuming this is being used in a derogatory way, though I may be wrong. For the record, I am not a developer, at least not in the traditional sense. I do own real estate beyond just my home, and I have "developed" or built properties in Bolinas, my home, a second unit and the house I own and rent at 555 Dogwood. I have done all of these with the necessary permits and have been challenged every time. I have learned a lot. While people may not like what I have built, I currently house 3 Bolinas families, all of whom are paying reasonable and "relatively affordable" rents. I do not make any money on these rentals and in fact subsidize each one to some extent. It may be hard for some people to believe that someone would do that, but it is in fact true.

To be sure I am someone of privilege. I don't hide this fact nor shrink from it. I received my inheritance early and up front. It was a gift and I felt like I had won the lottery. I was raised middleclass and suddenly I had a world of opportunity open to me. Some people invest their money in the stock market, I have chosen to put mine in real estate, and in real estate that serves people and a greater good. Is this evil?

I came to Bolinas 17 years ago as a renter and a single mom in a lot of distress. The community opened its arms to me and to my children and I was entirely grateful. I was taught through my upbringing as a Quaker that life is about community and about doing right by others, and that one gains joy by working for the good of ones whole community. In an effort to "give back" here, I first served on the school board for 13 years. Later, when I had run my course there and saw families leaving in droves, I joined the BCLT board. Through a number of twists and turns I am now the executive director. I serve in this position because I care, and care deeply. I don't need this job, and have plenty else I could be doing. I do this job because I believe this town is worth saving and that because of its unique elements, it can be saved, and can be a model for other small communities to do the same. I am always happy to speak with people about the work we are doing and am available in the office most Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays. I hope if you have questions or concerns that you will seek me out for conversation and information rather than rushing to conclusions or counting on hearsay as a reliable source of information.

What creates 'opposition?' I think opposition happens when one side won't listen to the other side. BCLT made a presentation to our neighborhood, showing future development plans. After a number of questions were raised, a second public meeting was held at the firehouse. A primary question from neighbors on Overlook and Aspen was: How can we be involved with the planning of new development? The answer came back: "The neighbors have very little say." Neighbors formed MUSSEL. The group continually reached out to BCLT to interface, and after 2 months, 5 board members met with MUSSEL ~ once. Our request was "can we participate in the planning prior to involving the County" The answer was : "No, you can see our plans once they are filed with the County." This is what creates opposition, no matter how well meaning a group is, if they refuse to meaningfully involve stakeholders, it becomes a standoff for outsiders (the County) to mediate. Maybe it is easy for those with blind faith in the abilities of BCLT to fulfill their promises to the community to assume that the neighbors just don't want "low income people" living next door. Not true. If the development happens, we expect that people we know will be our neighbors. Our (MUSSEL) questioning centers around habitat loss, lack of long range strategic planning, open space, density, and adherence to the well-intentioned and values-based Bolinas Community Plan and Gridded Mesa Plan.

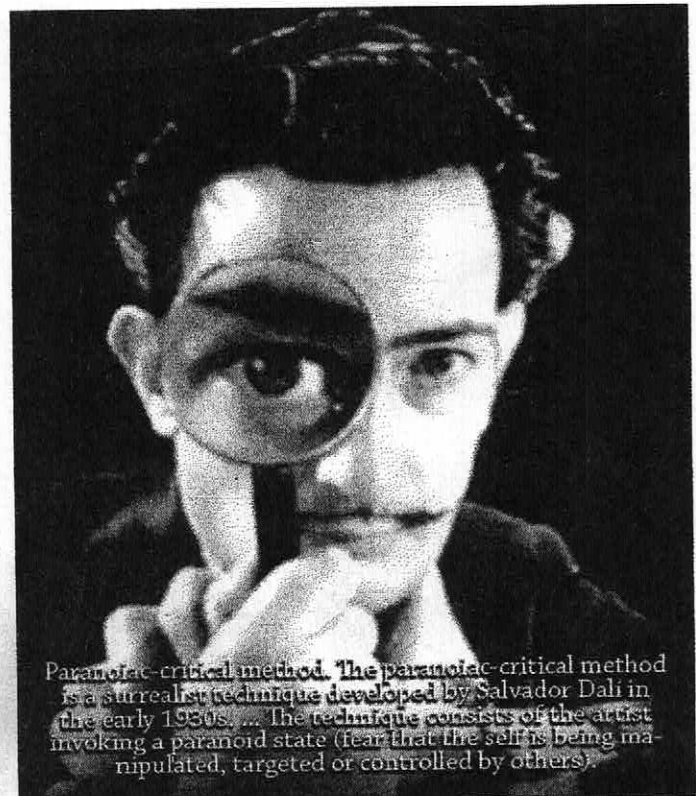
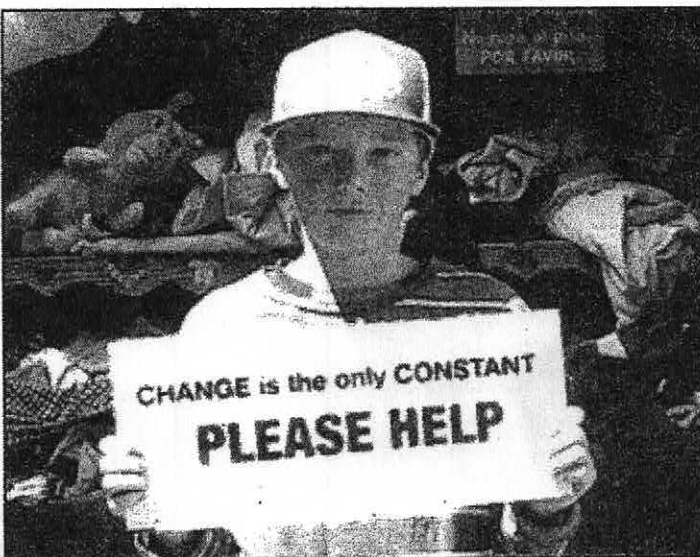
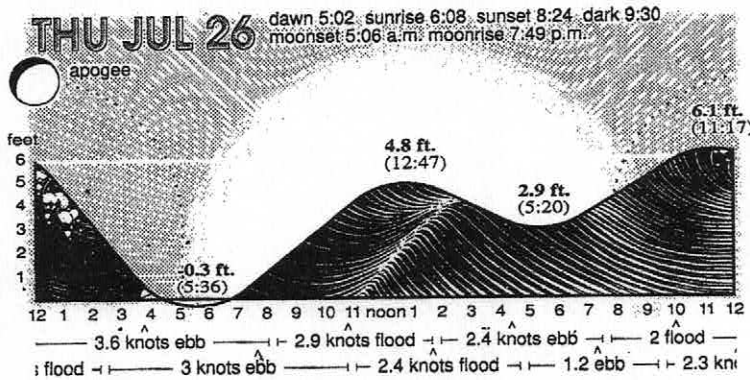
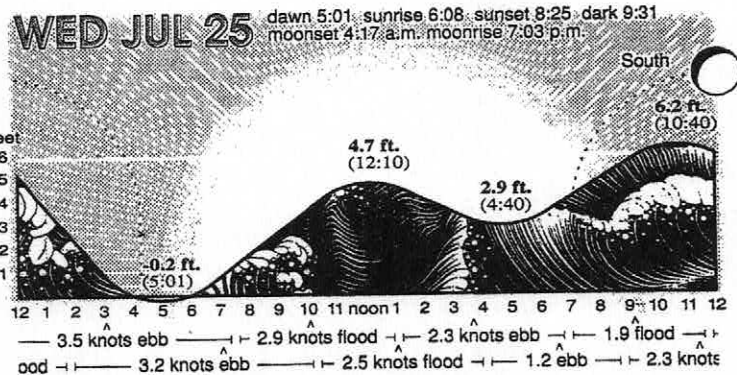
