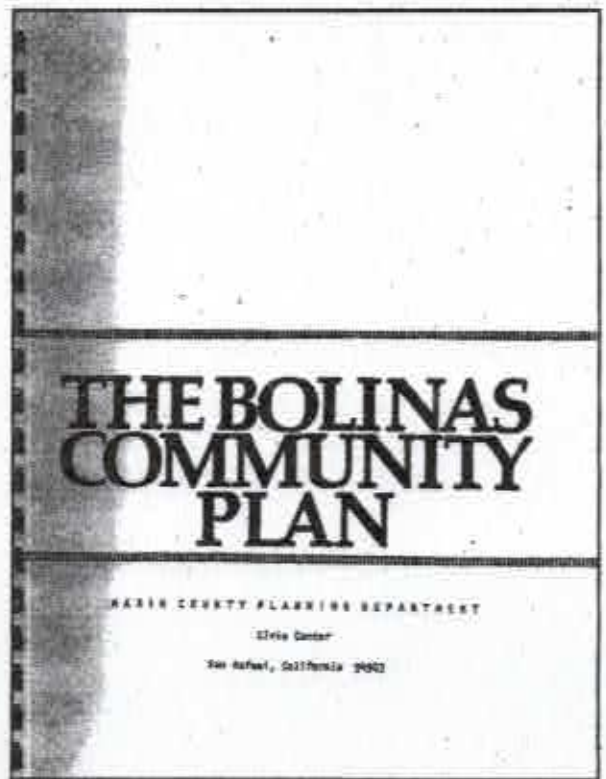

Town Plan

"On assignment for the Hearsay News" sprang to mind as I sauntered over to the Commons for the Town Plan workshop. Reading the town plan aloud to each other was the thrust of the workshop. Entering into dialogue about the plan was the purpose.

"Why would I want to spend twenty bucks for a document that I can get for free online or at the library?" my friend remarked.

"Exactly," I answered. "This workshop is a unique opportunity to participate in real time with a real document, rather than some virtual screen image. It's not some bogus internet freebie."

Having dissed the digital realm, and feeling better for it, I made my way to the Commons, and plunked down \$20 for a copy of the town plan, circa 1975.

We sat in a circle, each with our bound copy of The Bolinas Community Plan. It felt like a Bible study group (the Bible of Bolinas)

We started reading the Goals of the Bolinas Peninsula Community Plan. We persuaded Howard Dillon to intone in his marvelous English brogue.

I felt the River of History running though that room in the Commons. History was speaking to us and history was also speaking through us. We were starting a dialogue about community and revisiting a vision of Bolinas that was set down at a pivotal point in the town's evolution.

Talked about the changes that have happened since the plan was drafted, and began to appreciate the scope of the plan, its language and intent.

Homework assignments were self assigned. I offered to make a game board out of all the competing agencies that actually rule Bolinas. And I also hoped to make the town plan into a song. Like Measure G and "socially acknowledged nature loving town" the Town Plan should be sung, and danced, as well as studied and dialogued.

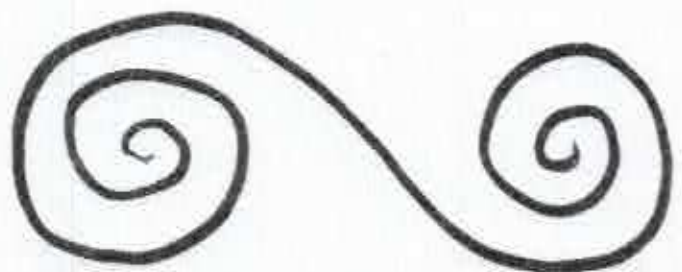
