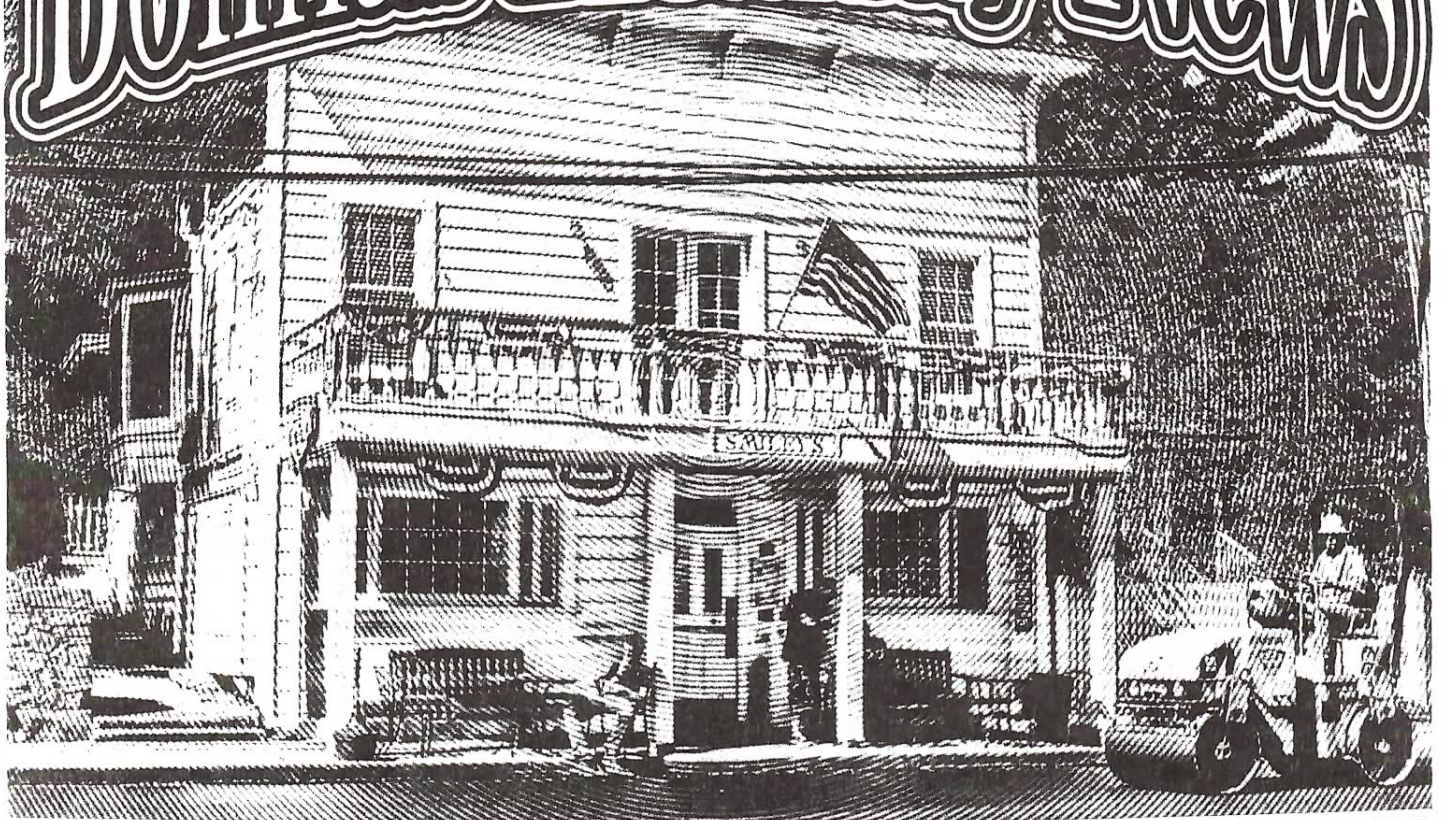

Mission Statement Song

On Saturday I gave a presentation for the Community Center to the Stinson Bolinas Fund. "Local grants for locals" is their motto, and every year they invite a few of their grant recipients to make a presentation to the Board. Randi, our Development Director, had a bum knee, and Lia, our manager, had a sore throat, so as President, I was drafted to represent the Community Center.

The meeting was held at the Murch place, Gospel Flats Farm. It was a beautiful day and Sarah and Don had made fresh pizza in the big outdoor oven.

Lia and Randi had worked out a presentation and had provided me with plenty of paperwork to present to the Board. But I already had in mind the presentation I was going to make. I was going to sing the Community Center mission statement song.

Two years ago the Community Center Board hired Carol Friedman to give a workshop on Board duties and responsibilities. Carol Friedman is brilliant and is responsible for the success of the Dance Palace in Pt. Reyes. She's also a dance instructor.

When Carol gave the workshop she started by asking if everyone knew the mission statement of the Community Center. No one did, and she suggested that we all memorize it. I had seen a picture in the *West Marin Citizen* of Carol leading a flash mob dance at the Farmers Market in Pt. Reyes.

So just for fun I raised my hand and said, "Carol, I'll write a song based on the mission statement if you'll lead us in dancing to it."

"It's a deal," she answered. So over the next couple of weeks I worked on setting the mission statement to music. I wrote out the statement over and over, concentrating on the line breaks and prosody (the rhythm of the words). Eventually I began to hear the melody in the words and I put it into a song.

Six months later we had another workshop with Carol Friedman, this time about fundraising, I sang the song and she led the Community Center board in dance. It was great fun.

Now at the beginning of every Board meeting, we all sing the mission statement together. Singing together raises the vibratory rate and puts us all on the same page. Board meetings are more enjoyable than ever

Here's the mission statement in song. It's impossible to convey the melody, but you can get an idea by reading it with the all important line breaks.

I hadn't brought my guitar so I sang the mission statement acapella to the board members of the Stinson Bolinas Fund. I missed the rhythmic accompaniment of the guitar, but unencumbered I was able to wave my hands around and gesticulate freely. I could tell by the smiles on the faces of the Board that once again the vibratory rate had been raised by singing.

After the song, I gave a brief presentation to the Board, reading from notes that Lia had given me:

The Community Center is presently involved in two major capital improvement projects; An upgrade of the kitchen and an upgrade of sound and light in the main hall. I have copies of our 2013 budget, the Marin County Block Grant for 2013 (we went for the kitchen remodel for \$19,499.12 and got denied) and a copy of our Sound & Light Remodel Project which we have applied grants to both Bothin and to the Rex Foundation. Bothin denied us and we haven't heard back from the Rex Foundation yet.

The next step is to go to George Lucas for the Sound & Light project. We have already raised about \$3,600 for our Sound & Light this year with the Freebox Follies and BBQ & Blues. We are in the process of having our stationary sound booth built with the help of Nick Bogle.

As for Kitchen Remodel, we raised about \$10,000 with last year's Food Festival and around \$4,000 with the Crab Feast. We have spent \$7,000 this spring on three new Health Department mandated sinks, an up-to-code work table, new flooring, FRP (Fire Retardant Protective) walls, and an ADA handicap door. We hope to raise another \$10,000 with this October's Food Festival and thus do the remaining work that needs to be done in the kitchen.

Later after all the presentations were made I was approached by Board members of both the Stinson Bolinas Fund and the Stinson Beach Community Center.

"Maybe you could also put our mission statements to song," they suggested.

"Wow!" I thought. "I've got a new career."

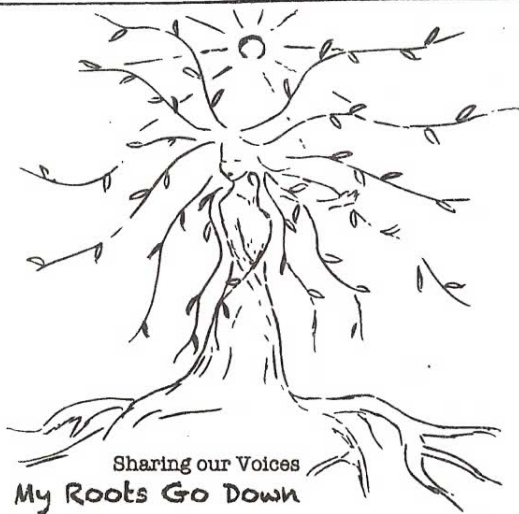

MESA PARK BOARD MEETING

August 12, 2013 7:00 PM

Bolinas Firehouse

Call to Order: 7:00 PM

Members present: Bryan Lee, Charles Whitefield, Dylan Squires, Jane Mickelson. Patricia Hickey, absent
Others: Vic Amoroso, Roger Peacock, Jack Siedman, Jenny Pfeiffer

Community Expression: none

Action Item: Entering into a Legal Service Agreement with County Council

[Bryan] I've seen the copy of the agreement, which states that we will pay hourly when we need legal advice at \$205/hour. It will be as needed, with an estimate up front so we can then decide whether or not to go with it. I move to adopt the agreement between us and the County Council. Dylan second, all aye.

Downtown Park: [Roger] We installed the boat in the play area. The museum used it in the parade and we raised about \$9500 to help defray the costs. We're considering placing round plastic windows over the portholes to make it more difficult for kids to climb up on the roof. We hosted a workshop on cob-making to help install the cob oven. There were a lot of volunteers to lend hands. We still have the chimney and the pavilion roof to complete. We're going to have a training program for working the oven. After that we're pretty much done. The BPUD raised some concerns about water use, but once the natives are established there should be minimal water needed. We have a native grass that would go dormant without water during the summer. We'd like to look into putting in a well. There used to be a community well in downtown Bolinas. It could be a shallow well. It's in the sandstone formation that holds a lot of water. There's an old well in that area that's only 15' deep, hand dug long ago. It would be an agricultural well, non-potable, but could be used for toilets and plants. I'd like to pursue looking into it. We've got a big storage tank for run-off, but it could be used for water storage from a well instead. [Dylan] It may be time to do a deep clean of the restrooms. They could be disinfected. [Roger] I'll see if we can borrow a pressure washer.

Maintenance Report: Suki not present. [Charles] We got approval to get an easement to use the Techerra's road to drive past the skateboard park for a future access road to the future pool.

Irrigation Report:

Action item: Approve check for the coastal permit.
[BRYAN] Christine Cunha gave us a check for \$5,694 for the coastal permit. That will be reimbursed into our account with the grant. It may take 3-5 months to get it through, but Lisa Cross is helping to shepherd it through, which will put us into January. That's the last permit, and after this we can break ground. There's one last item on the grant and I'm going to Sacramento Thursday to meet with them. All the money for the reclaiming project will be listed as match for the grant. [Dylan] I move to approve the check, Jane 2nd, all aye. [Jack] The soccer field soil was packed too hard by the county when they put all that soil on the field. Can the board ask the county to dig it up and mix in amendments? [Bryan] They're in default of the agreement, none of the restoration and improvement happened. [Jack] When the field re-grading happens, I'd recommend asking the county to contribute.

Treasurer's Report: [Dylan] I met with Christine & Patricia and the DT park was relatively stable, nothing's happening at Mesa Park, and I signed 3 tax returns for about \$6400 from the county. That goes into the MP account. [Jack] Lisa Cross sent me a questionnaire about MP for future Measure A funding, which I filled out. I received a communication shortly thereafter with an estimate for future funding. This is a draft budget and it hasn't been approved yet. [Vic] They're already collecting sales tax towards Measure A.

Up-date on election status: [Jane] There are now 4 candidates for the 3 open BPUD board. They have until 8/14 to withdraw their names from the ballot. If it stays at 4, we will have at least one other agency on the ballot, which will save us considerable financial expense. We now have Measure 1 on the ballot, for the parcel tax to pay for maintenance of the Mesa Park recreational area and support systems next to the Firehouse & Clinic. I am writing up the Argument for the voter pamphlet and have 5 people (the maximum number allowed) who have committed to endorsing it.

Also, I contacted Lynne Axelrod to ask for a correction on a mistake in her article on the BPUD meeting, attributing the water leak to the Mesa Park. In the next issue she made that correction.

Other: Donation of a sculpture for the park. Jane presented the idea, asked feed-back from Roger [Roger] The design committee for the DT park decided not to take donated sculpture because there were a number of offers and we couldn't take them all. It's more complicated than simply taking it and putting it in place. There's a legal procedure about accepting, and about how to handle any pieces in the future (for example, can it be sold or donated on). [Jack] We wanted to see how the park spaces worked first, and then maybe later have a specific place for a rotation of pieces. [Bryan] Maybe we could work with the museum people about it, but there's the liability issue as well. [Jack] You might consider simply asking for loaning for a specific time period, then returning it. [Roger] I will bring it up with the design committee.

Approve Warrants: None

Approve Minutes: Bryan moves to approve, Dylan 2nd, all in favor.

Next meeting: September 9, 7 PM

Meeting adjourned: 8:80
