Home Sweet Bobo

The performance of Act One of the street opera "Home Sweet Bobo" will take place this Sunday at 6pm at the Community Center.

The complete opera has 18 songs written by a small town troubadour about Bolinas over the past 40 years. I call myself a small town troubadour because, like the Troubadours of old, I write songs about the place I love, which is Bolinas.

"Bolinas, Bolinas" is in the opera. The song was given to me by my friend Adan from Patzcuaro, Mexico. He and his partner Myra lived in Bolinas for a year. Before he left he gave me the idea for a song.

"I have the guitar part," he told me, "but only two words."

"Two words are enough for a song." I told Adan, "what are they?"

"Bolinas, Bolinas" he answered.

"Adan, that's not two words, that's the same word twice!"

But that's how the song came to be. It's at the end of Act One and segues right into "Border Patrol" which is a song about the local vigilantes that tore down the sign.

All these songs are historic artifacts, but still have some relevance today. The Bolinas Border Patrol no longer exists, but it persists as a myth and a t-shirt.

Kathleen helped me string together a bunch of the "historic artifacts" into a storyline, an "opera" if you will.

"Home Sweet Bobo" is a musical offering to the place I love. It has special significance to me because tomorrow is my 70th birthday. I moved to Bolinas in 1976 and I've been through numerous incarnations in this town. I've been up and I've been down or as it's sung in "Bolinas, Bolinas"

"Been my agony — and ecstasy"

"Home Sweet Bobo" is the best birthday present, or should I say a birthday presence. It's a chance to gather with friends and sing songs about the place where I live.

Part of that presence is the miniature stage set for the opera. It's downtown Bolinas, the middle of Wharf Road between Smiley's and the Market.

Recreating Bolinas in Bolinas means we have a magical space to play in. We can hold Bolinas in our hands in the heart of Bolinas, the Community Center.

We enter a ritual space and we play together, and especially we sing together. We are Bolinas reliving

the story of our town, the myths of our time.

Other scenic elements have arrived to help with the transformation of myth into mirth.

Notable among those elements is the Purple Paisley Dumpster, a magical box that can move and think.

And the Funky VW Bus which arrives with the hippies to help clean up the oil spill.

Of course the Freebox is in the opera. It's a portal of constant costume changes.

The Sheriff Cow doesn't make its appearance until Act Two. The Sheriff Cow refers to the line in the song "Sheriff's Call" which goes "black and white cow, middle of the road - Sheriff's Call"

That song occurred to me when I was working at the Point Reyes Light. Dave Mitchell's column "Sheriff's Calls" was popular at the time and I thought if I could write a Sheriff's Call song I'd have an inexhaustible supply of material for the verses.

That song came true, and so did the Sheriff Cow, which is now a life-size cut-out.

We're going to sing "Sheriff's Call" on Sunday night (6pm) as a teaser for Act Two.

Because, who knows, maybe Act Two and Three of "Home Sweet Bobo" will be performed in the future.

For now, Act One is the sweetest birthday present I could imagine. Thank you, cast and crew. Thank you, audience. Thank you, Bolinas.

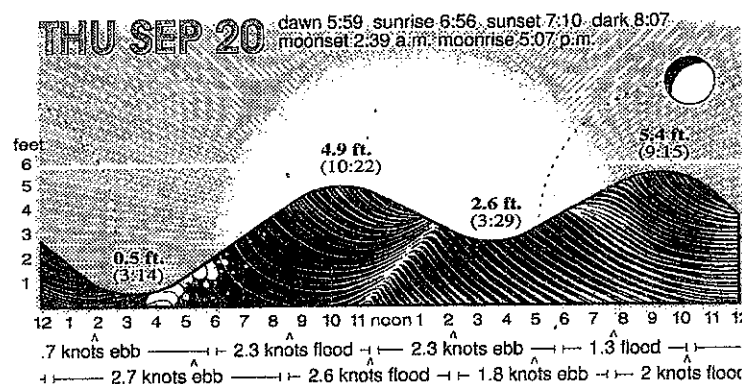
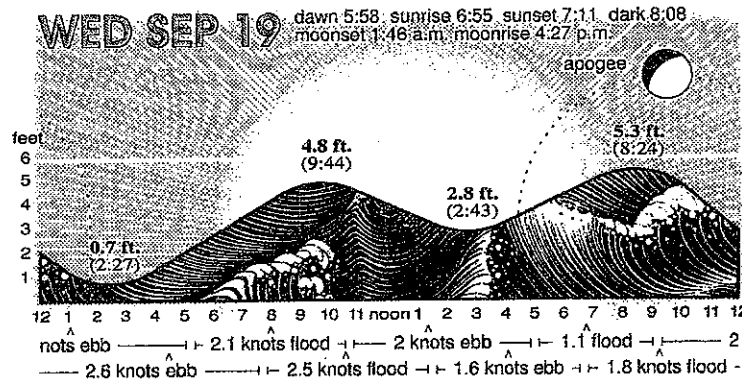
