Ever wondered what has made the Freebox Follies what it is? I have been holding the container for this one-off only in Bolinas event and for the past 10 years and most the time I have sat back stage and listened for the response that lets me know it really was not folly but good medicine. Now, as I am ready to step away from the fashion "modeling" and coming out as a co-creator, I would like to share with you what I have been doing during the months of personal folly, which most people assumed I was doing out of some personal talent or ability (and maybe it is an ability but it is not the ability that you might think it is).

So lets recognize that it is not going to happen because someone invites me to speak about the creative process of the Follies and it is not going to happen at the show when I am preoccupied with it's annual birth. Lets take the opportunity to examine what it is now and take the opportunity to look at why it matters to us as community, and how it can continue to be a co-creative manifestation of willingness and vulnerability and a place to Rise Up! and take our place in collective possibility.

I have booked the community center to give my final thoughts or first thoughts as to why this event matters in our collective experience, including the experience of those who have never seen it or participated, and how it could continue to keep from becoming a simple talent/fashion show and be what it has always been to me...the Free Box and all of it's attributes made manifest in a verb, To Free Box.

So if you have been curious about what I am doing during these months leading up, have wanted to find a way to contribute without over extending yourself, or even if you have held resentments over it's change from the Freebox Fashion show and ideas of being betrayed by it...then this is the time for you to find out what I've really been giving to it and why I have done it and what it has meant to it's continuation that people, of their own joy and willingness, have showed up to make it possible in all their unique ways.


Maybe we are in the middle, maybe we are in the end, or just maybe we are just at the beginning.



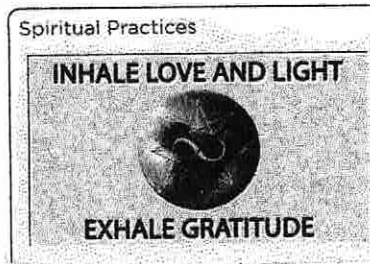

February 5 begins The Year of the Earth Pig

For me horoscopes, and other classifications of people helps me to be more compassionate to others. If I can remember that someone is a Leo, I find it easier to forgive them hogging the limelight. 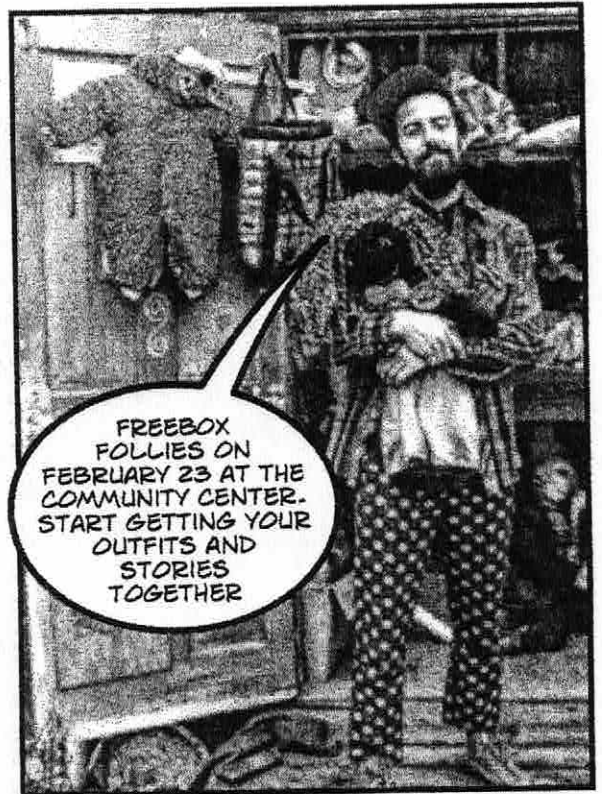
The Pigs Strengths

5. Resigned to and tolerant of others' scorn.

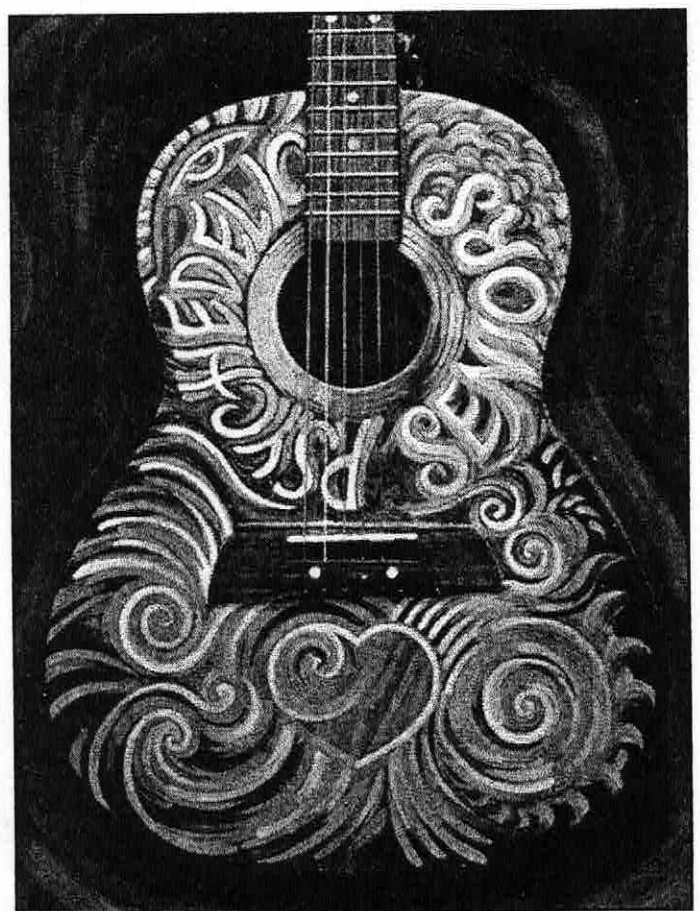
Possible Weaknesses the pig can suffer
